**RESOLUTION OF THE MT. JULIET BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO FURTHER EXPLAIN THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

**WHEREAS**, the Mt. Juliet Board of Commissioners support the Charter of the City of Mt. Juliet: and

**WHEREAS**, the current Charter and Code of the City of Mt. Juliet implies that the Board of Commissioners should not supersede the City Manager's powers and duties nor give orders to the City Staff.

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Commissioners desire to further explain and clarify the responsibilities of the Board of Commissioners.


**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MT. JULIET, TENNESSEE THAT THE FOLLOWING IS ADOPTED TO FURTHER CLARIFY THE DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS:**

**SECTION 1.** Unless otherwise provided in the City Code, neither the commission, nor any of its members, shall attempt to supersede the City Manager's powers and duties. Neither the commission nor any member thereof shall give orders to any of the department heads, employees or staff, either publicly or privately. Commission members shall not attempt to unethically influence or coerce city staff concerning either their actions or recommendations to commission about personnel, purchasing, awarding contracts, selection of consultants, processing of development applications, or the granting of city licenses and permits.


No person shall be chosen or appointed to the board of commissioners or selected to any position who is not in good standing with local and state law.

**SECTION 2.** This resolution shall take effect on the first date allowed by law.


