7. Commissioner Reports & Comments

Commissioner Giles thanked everyone for attending the meeting, including those from his district. He commented on the recent vigil held in the City of Mt. Juliet, expressing appreciation to the preachers and musicians who participated, and encouraged everyone to continue praying for the family. Regarding the Mira Bella development, Commissioner Giles noted that he has reconsidered his prior position. He stated that he can no longer support the development because Lebanon Road is not included in the 10-year transportation plan. He further commented that blasting has become excessive within the city.

Commissioner Hefner echoed Commissioner Giles' remarks about Charlie Kirk's vigil, and noted the importance of bringing people together to engage in discussion even when there is disagreement. He expressed appreciation for everyone who attended the meeting to voice their opinions. He addressed comments regarding the Planning Commission, acknowledging both negative and positive feedback, and clarified that all appointments are made by the Mayor except for the BOC representative. Commissioner Hefner stated he was extremely proud of how the new Mt. Juliet Police Department building turned out. He apologized to those he was unable to respond to by email and again thanked everyone for coming out.

Commissioner Milele thanked everyone for attending the meeting, noting that it takes effort for citizens to come out and participate. She stated that she had reached out to Public Works regarding the Mira Bella development and will ask them to come speak when the items come before the Board. She commented that the Charlie Kirk vigil went very well and expressed her thankfulness to live in a city where events like this can be held.

Mayor Maness reflected on Charlie Kirk's life, stating that he lived a good life and that he hopes to emulate him. He noted that he had responded to all emails received regarding the Mira Bella development. The Mayor commented that while the development is a beautiful project, he shared concerns raised during the public comments regarding sewer capacity and emergency response times. From a financial standpoint, he stated that he is against growth that stretches the City's resources too thin.

8. City Manager's Report

City Manager Martin thanked everyone for attending and stated that Mt. Juliet is the most patriotic city in the country. He encouraged residents and businesses to display American flags, noting that this is the only country we have.

He expressed thankfulness for sidewalks and the work of the Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC). He also thanked Commissioner Milele and Commissioner Giles for their efforts.

City Manager Martin concluded his comments by encouraging everyone to shop local.

Mayor Maness stated that Items 10.A. through 10.E. would be read together. There was no objection.

Commissioner Hefner provided context on the City's Urban Growth Boundary, noting that other options would remain available if the project were to fail, such as development in the county. He discussed alternatives to blasting, adding that the developer is a local resident who plans to live in the neighborhood.

Commissioner Milele agreed with many of Commissioner Hefner's points, expressing disappointment that the item was not deferred and that Vice Mayor Trivett was not present to provide input. She stated that she liked the project and found it to be a beautiful development, and explained her conversations with Public Works regarding road improvements and the TDOT 10-year plan.

Commissioner Giles stated that voluntary contributions are not collected up front, that Lebanon Road improvements only extend to West Elementary School, and that he agreed with the Mayor in not supporting the project.

Mayor Maness reiterated that while a property may be located within the City's Urban Growth Boundary, that does not require annexation. He expressed long-term concerns with out-of-city sewer service.

The Mayor opened the floor for staff input. City Traffic Engineer Todd Serpent stated concerns with traffic accessing Lebanon Road. Commissioner Milele asked the Director of Engineering Shane Shamanur to address an email that had been received earlier in the day.

Discussion was held.

Commissioner Hefner asked the applicant about build time. Applicant responded that construction would begin in 2027 and take approximately 8-10 years to complete.

Discussion was held on sewer capacity. Commissioner Hefner asked Utilities Director Tim Forkum about the use of rock saws, to which he responded that he had no issue with them as an alternative to blasting. The applicant confirmed they were agreeable to this alternative.

Discussion was held on extending coverage for MJPD and MJFD, as well as on the proposed gated community and its effect on police zones.

Emily Lamb, Winston Law Firm, 1221 Broadway, and Kyle Allen, applicant, stated that materials would be stored off site with Mr. Bradshaw.

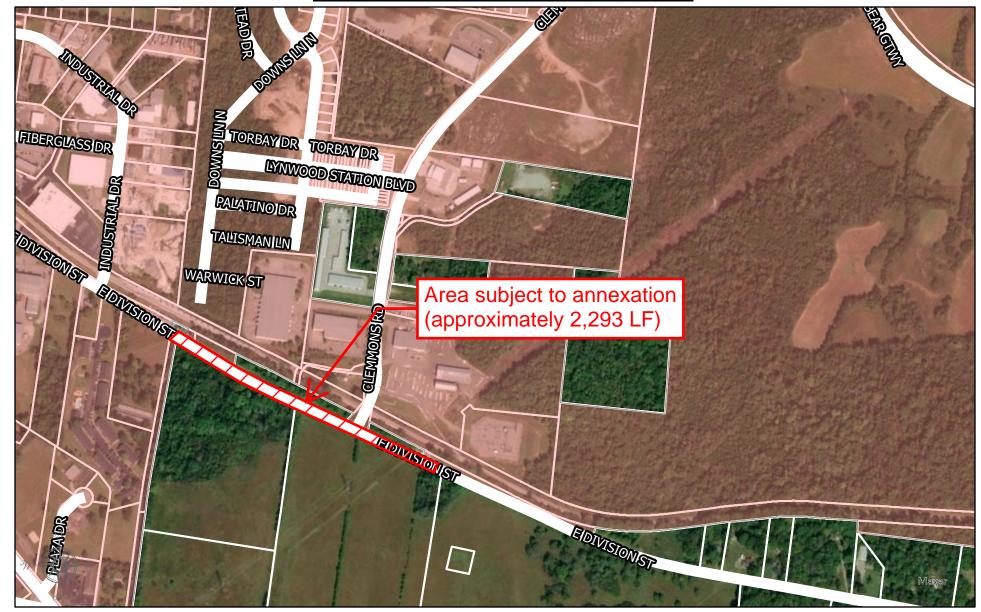

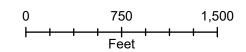
Exhibit B - E Division St Annexation

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated Section 6-51-102 an amended requires a Plan of Services be adopted by the governing body of a city prior of passage of an annexation ordinance of any territory which may be annexed within any 12 month period; and

WHERAS, the City of Mt. Juliet (herein referred to as "City") contemplates annexation of property known as E Division St Roadway and Right-of-Way located around Clemmons Rd, In Wilson County, Tennessee, as described herein;

A. Police:

1. Patrolling, radio responses to calls, and all other calls, and other routine police services, using present personnel and equipment, will be provided beginning on the effective date of annexation.

B. Fire:

1. The City of Mt. Juliet will assume primary responsibility for Fire Protection/Emergency Medical Services with mutual aid assistance from the Wilson County Emergency Management Agency.

C. Water:

1. Water for domestic and commercial is already and will continue to be provided by the West Wilson Utility District.

D. Sanitary Sewers:

- 1. Sanitary Sewer infrastructure exists at or near the subject property boundary. Any required extension of the public sanitary sewer infrastructure shall be the responsibility of the developer of the subject property.
- 2. The annexation of existing developed areas that are not presently on sanitary sewer will not have sewer extended to the properties until funding is appropriated for such extensions or another funding mechanism is approved.

E. Refuse Collection:

1. Refuse Collection is available from private companies in the area. The City of Mt. Juliet has no current plans to offer refuse collection or solid waste disposal services in any area of the City.

F. Public Streets:

- 1. Emergency maintenance of streets designated as public streets, built to City of Mt. Juliet Standards and dedicated to the City of Mt. Juliet by recording of a final plat as public streets (repair of hazardous pot holes, measures necessary for traffic flows, etc.) will become available on the effective date of annexation.
- 2. Routine maintenance of streets designated, built and dedicated as public streets, on the same basis as in the present City, will become available in the annexed area when funds from the state gasoline tax based on the annexed population are received (usually July 1, following the effective date of annexation.)
- 3. Reconstruction and resurfacing of streets designated, built and dedicated as public streets, installation of storm drainage facilities, construction of curbs and gutters, and other such major improvements will be accomplished under current policies of the City or as funds are made available.
- 4. Cleaning of streets designated, built and dedicated as public streets having curbs and gutters will be considered after the effective date of annexation on the same basis as the cleaning of streets within the present City.
- 5. Traffic signals, traffic signs, street markings, and other traffic control devices will be installed on public streets as the need is established, by appropriate study and traffic standards.

G. Schools:

1. The entire annex area is served by Wilson County Schools. This annexation will have no effect on school districts.

H. Inspection Services:

1. Any inspection service now provided by the City (building, plumbing, electrical, gas, housing and City of Mt. Juliet by Ordinance, etc) will become available in the annexed area on the effective date of annexation.

I. Planning:

1. The Planning Jurisdiction of the City already includes the annexed area. The property herein annexed is recommended to be zoned: N/A

J. Street Lighting

1. The City only installs streetlights on main thoroughfares (currently Mt. Juliet Road/SR171 and Lebanon Road/US Highway 70).

L. Electrical Service

1. Electrical service for domestic and commercial uses is already and will continue to be provided by the Middle Tennessee Electric Membership Cooperative.

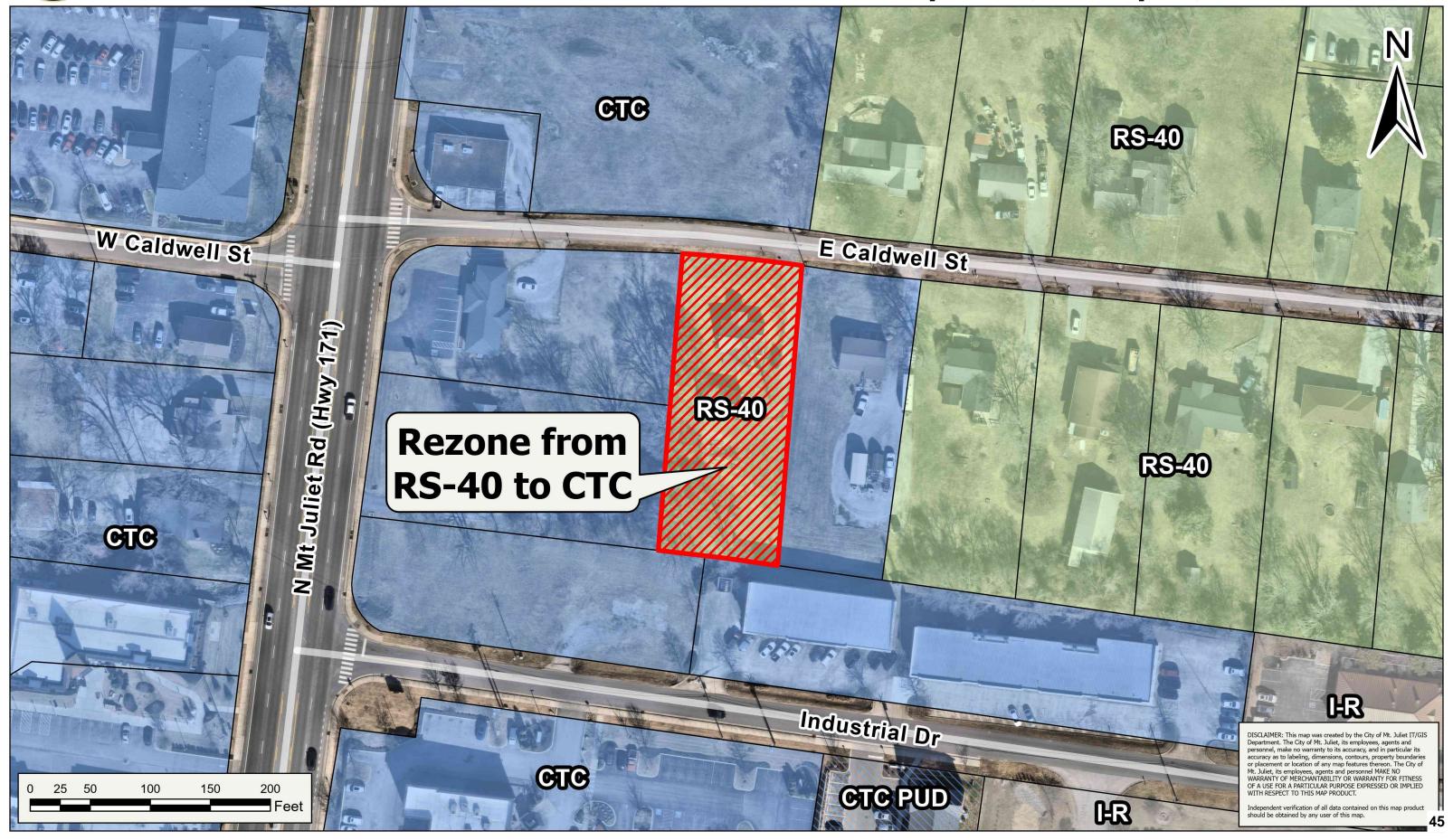

PURCHASE AGREEMENT

THIS PURCHASE AGREEMENT (the "Agreement") made and entered into as the Effective Date defined in Paragraph 25, by and between **CITY OF MT. JULIET TENNESSEE** (the "Seller") and **TULIT INVESTMENTS, LLC,** and its successors and assigns (the "Buyer"); with **ROCHELLE, McCULLOCH & AULDS, PLLC** (the "Escrow Agent") joining herein for the limited purposes hereinafter set forth.

WITNESSETH:

- Agreement for Sale. In consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) which has this day been paid to Seller by Buyer, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, Seller hereby agrees to enter this Agreement to convey two tracts of unimproved land located on Golden Bear Gateway in Mt. Juliet, TN being further described as Wilson County Tax Parcel Number 077 012.02 being approximately 5.16 +/- acres and Wilson County Tax Parcel Number 077 011.01 being approximately 1.32 +/- acres (including all rights, privileges, easements and appurtenances pertaining to the land and strips or gores between the land and abutting properties) (collectively the "Property"). Said Property is further depicted on Collective Exhibit "A" attached hereto and made a part hereof. The survey obtained pursuant to Paragraph 5, herein, may be attached hereto upon completion and the description for the Property as shown on said survey or resulting plat may at the option of Buyer be used as the legal description in the deed to Buyer.
- **Purchase Price and Method of Payment.** The purchase price for the Property to be paid by Buyer to Seller shall be One Million Eight Hundred Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$1,800,000.00) (the "Purchase Price") (which shall be contingent on the actual acreage determined by the Survey obtained pursuant to Section 5 below to be a collective 6.48 acres). The Purchase Price shall be paid in cash or certified funds at Closing.

All closing adjustments pursuant to this Agreement, including the Earnest Money, will be credits or debits to the Purchase Price at Closing.

3. Deposits.

(i) Within ten (10) business days after the Effective Date of this Agreement, Buyer shall deliver the sum of Twenty-Five Thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$25,000) to the Escrow Agent. (such amount and any interest thereon shall hereinafter be collectively referred to as the "Initial Deposit") to be held in escrow in accordance with the terms of this Agreement.

- (ii) Within ten (10) business days following the expiration of the Feasibility Period, Buyer shall deliver to the Escrow Agent, an additional Twenty-Five and 00/100 Dollars (\$25,000) (such amount and any interest thereon shall hereinafter be referred to as an "Additional Deposit"). The Initial Deposit and Additional Deposit are collectively referred to herein as the "Deposit." The Deposit shall be credited against the Purchase Price at Closing. The Deposit shall be non-refundable to the Buyer following the Feasibility Period other than for Seller's default.
- (iii) At Closing, Buyer shall pay to Seller the balance of the Purchase Price net of the Deposit that shall be released to the Seller by the Escrow Agent.
- 4. <u>Title.</u> During the Feasibility Period, Buyer shall, at its expense,, obtain a title insurance commitment (the "Commitment") issued by **ROCHELLE**, **McCULLOCH & AULDS**, **PLLC** (the "Title Insurance Company"). Buyer shall have thirty (30) days after the date of Buyer's receipt of the Commitment within which to examine the Commitment and to advise Seller of any objections to the title. In turn, Seller shall satisfy all valid objections within a reasonable time not to exceed fifteen (15) days after receipt of notice of Buyer's objection and, if Seller fails to satisfy these objections within such period, then, at Buyer's option, the sale may be closed subject to said matters or Buyer may terminate this Agreement by written notice to Seller within fifteen (15) days from the end of Seller's cure period. In the event that this Agreement is terminated for any reason set forth in this Paragraph, the Initial Deposit shall be refunded to Buyer, each party shall be released from any further liability to the other (except for indemnification under Paragraph 7), and the failure of the sale to close shall not be a breach by either party.
- 5. Survey. Within the Feasibility Period (as defined here in below), Buyer, at its expense, may obtain an ALTA survey of the Property and let seller have every right to the survey after completion of it. Any survey shall set forth the outside perimeter of the Property, shall contain a metes and bounds description of the Property, shall set forth the acres included within the Property to the nearest 1/100th of an acre, shall be in sufficient form and content for submission to and approval by the applicable governmental authorities as a subdivision plat for the Property, and shall be sufficient in form and content so that the Title Company, as defined herein, issuing the title insurance commitment and policy set forth in Paragraph 4 hereof will remove the standard printed survey exception from the title insurance policy and replace it with an exception for the specific matters shown on such survey. The survey shall be certified to Buyer, Seller, to Escrow Agent, and to the Title Insurance Company, and shall be in form and content reasonably satisfactory to all such parties. The metes and bounds description for the Property as shown on said survey may, at the option of the Buyer, be used in the deed to Buyer. In the event the survey shows any easement, right-of-way, encroachment, conflict, protrusion or other matter affecting the

Property, other than the "Permitted Encumbrances" (as hereinafter defined), that in Buyer's opinion (as determined in its sole and absolute discretion) is unacceptable to Buyer, Buyer shall, within fifteen (15) days after receipt of the survey and Title Commitment and copies of all documents referred to as exceptions therein as provided in Paragraph 4 hereof, notify Seller in writing of such fact and the reasons therefore ("Buyer's Survey Objections"). Upon the expiration of said fifteen (15) day period, Buyer shall be deemed to have accepted the form and substance of the survey and all matters shown thereon (except for the Buyer's Survey Objections if same are timely raised) and such matters shall be included in the term "Permitted Encumbrances" as used herein.

Not withstanding anything to the contrary contained herein, Seller shall have no obligation to bring any action or proceeding or otherwise to incur any expense whatsoever to eliminate or modify any of the Buyer's Survey Objections. In the event Seller is unable or unwilling to eliminate or modify the Buyer's Survey Objections to the satisfaction of Buyer, Buyer may, as its sole and exclusive remedies, (a) terminate this Agreement by notice in writing to Seller within fifteen (15) business days following receipt of notice from Seller that Seller is unwilling or unable to eliminate or modify Buyer's Survey Objections, or (b) accept the survey without any reduction in the Purchase Price, in which event such uncured Buyer's Survey Objections shall be included in the term "Permitted Encumbrances" as used herein. If Buyer does not elect to terminate this Agreement within the period described in the immediately preceding sentence, Buyer shall be deemed to have accepted the form and substance of the survey and all matters shown thereon and such matters shall be included in the term "Permitted Encumbrances" as used herein. In the event that this Agreement is terminated for any reason set forth in this paragraph, the Initial Deposit shall be released to Buyer, each party shall be released from any further liability to the other (except for indemnification under Paragraph 7), and the failure of the sale to close shall not be a breach by either party.

- **Representations of Seller.** Seller makes the following representations and warranties to Buyer:
- (i) Seller is the owner of all record, legal, and beneficial right, title and interest in and to the Property and the Property will be free, clear and unencumbered at Closing;
- (ii) There are no leases on the Property, and no tenants, occupants, or parties in possession on any portion of the Property other than Seller or there will be no leases, tenants or occupants or parties in possession at closing;

- (iii) Seller has the good and valid right to convey the Property to Buyer without the joinder or approval of any other person or entity whatsoever;
- (iv) Neither the entering into this Agreement nor the consummation of the transaction contemplated herein will cause a violation or breach by Seller of any contracts, agreements, or instruments to which Seller is a party or by which Seller or any of the Property is bound;
- (v) To the best of Seller's knowledge, all municipal services and public utilities including, without limitation, water, sewer, electricity and telephone, necessary for the development of the Property as a residential development are available to the Property in the public right-of-way immediately adjacent to the Property at normal and customary user rates;
- (vi) There is no pending condemnation or similar proceeding affecting the Property or any part thereof, and Seller has received no notice that any such proceeding is pending;
- (vii) There is no litigation or proceeding pending, or to Seller's knowledge threatened, against or relating to any of the Property;
- (viii) To the best of Seller's knowledge, except as may be shown on the Commitment, there are no title restrictions or laws (other than zoning and building codes and regulations) applicable to the Property, restricting Buyer's intended use of the property;
 - (ix) To the best of Seller's knowledge there are not wetlands present on the Property;
- (x) To the best of Seller's knowledge, no pollutants or other toxic or hazardous substances, including any solid, liquid, gaseous or thermal irritant or contaminant, such as smoke, vapor, soot, fumes, alkalis, acids, chemicals or wastes have been stored, discharged, released, generated, or allowed to escape from the Property, no asbestos or asbestos-containing materials are present on the Property, no underground storage tanks are located on the Property or have been removed or filled, no polychlorinated biphenyls ("PCBs") are located on or in the Property in the form of electrical transformers, fluorescent light fixtures with ballasts, cooling oils, or any other form, and no investigation, administrative order, consent order and agreement, litigation or settlement with respect to any of the foregoing is proposed, threatened, anticipated or in existence with respect to the Property; and

Each of the warranties and representations of Seller is true and correct as of the Effective Date and shall be true and correct as of the Closing Date. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Agreement (including, without limitation, the Seller representations and warranties

contained in this Section 6) and/or the documents to be provided by Seller in connection with Closing, Purchaser understands and hereby agrees that the sale of the Property is "AS IS, WHERE IS" with all faults and that Purchaser is relying on its own due diligence and investigation of the Property and is not relying on any other covenant, representation or warranty made by Seller or its agents in its decision to purchase the Property. Seller makes no warranties or representations regarding any condition of the Property that arises after the Closing.

Seller further covenants that it shall not encumber the Property or enter into any third-party contracts with regard to the Property, during the time period this Contract is in effect, without the prior written consent of the Purchaser. Seller further covenants that it shall cooperate with Purchaser in efforts to acquire approvals from any governmental or regulatory authority in connection with Purchaser's proposed use of the Property, including, without limitation, executing any instruments Purchaser deems reasonably necessary or desirable in connection therewith; provided, however, Seller shall not bear any expense in connection therewith.

7. **Inspection.** Buyer may go upon the Property through Buyer's own personnel, agents and engineers, assignees and any affiliate parties of the buyer as needed or desired to inspect, examine, survey or otherwise do whatever Buyer deems necessary by way of engineering and planning for the development of the Property. This privilege shall include the right to make soil test, borings and other tests required to obtain any information necessary to determine surface and subsurface conditions. In the exercise of the privileges granted by this Paragraph, Buyer shall substantially restore the Property to its original condition and shall indemnify and hold harmless Seller from all loss, damage or expense, including any claims of third parties for damage to personal property arising from or attributable to Buyer's use of the Property prior to the closing. Buyer shall give Seller access and rights to all studies performed during the duration of the feasibility period at no cost to Seller. Within ten (10) business days following the Effective Date, Seller shall furnish to Buyer all materials concerning the Property which Seller possesses, or which Seller may reasonably obtain, and Seller shall continue to furnish to Buyer within three (3) business days following Seller's receipt of same, all materials concerning the Property of which Seller acquires possession subsequent to the Effective Date, including, but not limited to, copies of all title insurance policies, plans, plats, surveys, zoning and Property use information, Agreements, soil tests and reports, environmental tests and reports, engineering studies, inspection reports, due diligence materials, CAD files, appraisals, feasibility studies, site plans and all other governmental and quasi-governmental applications, approvals, consents and authorizations relating to the Property. All of the information to be furnished under this Section shall collectively be referred to as the "Property Documents."

- **8.** <u>Contingencies.</u> The obligation of Buyer to complete the transactions contemplated by this Agreement is subject to the following conditions precedent (collectively, the "Buyer's Closing Conditions"), which conditions may be waived, or the time for satisfaction thereof extended, by Buyer only in a writing executed by Buyer:
- (i) Buyer obtaining financing for the Purchase Price satisfactory to Buyer, in Buyer's sole discretion; and
- (ii) Buyer obtaining all permits, licenses, easements, variances, certificates, exceptions, authorizations, approvals, agreements, and changes (exclusing building permits which Buyer shall obtain) as may be required for the lawful construction, installation, maintenance, and operation of the Buyer's intended development, all in accordance with Buyer's plans, specifications, and procedures; and,
- (iii) That all utilities necessary to serve the Property and intended development are in place or Buyer has access to such utilities satisfactory to Buyer with Buyer's payment of the normal tap fees or other access fees; and,
- (iv) The land conditions are satisfactory to Buyer's sole discretion for the development of the land for the intended use.

If any of Buyer's Closing Conditions described in Section 8 above have not been fulfilled within the applicable time periods, Buyer may: (a) Waive the unfulfilled Buyer's Closing Condition and close Escrow in accordance with this Agreement; (b) waive in writing the incomplete Condition(s) to Closing and proceed with Closing, and/or (iii) extend the date of the applicable Scheduled Closing one (1) day for each day until the Conditions to Closing are satisfied, such extensions not to exceed a total of ninety (90) days after the Scheduled Closing (or any extensions thereof). Notwithstanding the foregoing; (c) Terminate this Agreement by written notice to Seller and Escrow Agent, in which event the Independent Consideration shall be retained by Seller, Escrow Agent is hereby authorized to, and shall, immediately release and return the Deposit to Buyer, without any separate authorization from Seller.

9. Feasibility Period. Buyer shall have Two Hundred Forty (240) days from the Effective Date hereof (the "Feasibility Period") to conduct all inspections and any feasibility studies Buyer desires at Buyer's cost.

Buyer shall notify Seller within the Feasibility Period, or as it may be extended as set forth hereafter, of the fact the feasibility study reveals the Property to be unacceptable in Buyer's sole discretion and Buyer's desire to terminate this Agreement. Lack of the aforementioned notice shall be a waiver of any rights contained within this Paragraph 9. In the event Buyer notifies Seller of termination in a timely manner, the Initial Deposit and interest earned thereon shall be released to Seller, and neither party shall have further obligation to the other except for indemnity pursuant to Paragraphs 7.

Buyer shall have the right, in Buyer's sole discretion, to extend the Feasibility Period for up to two (2) additional sixty (60) day periods by giving written notice to Seller prior to the expiration of the Feasibility Period (or any subsequent extension). Upon exercising such extension right, Buyer shall deposit within five (5) business days after the delivery of such notice Five Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$5,000.00) for each such extension with the Escrow Agent (the "Extension Fee(s)"). The Extension Fee shall be non-refundable, except in the event of breach by Seller, but applicable to the Purchase Price.

The right to terminate this Agreement based on the Property being unacceptable to Buyer shall be deemed exclusively for the benefit of the Buyer and may be waived, in whole or in part, at Buyer's sole and absolute discretion.

- 10. <u>Condemnation.</u> If notice is given that all or any material portion of the Property shall be condemned or otherwise taken through the use of the power of eminent domain prior to the closing, or if Seller receives notice or becomes otherwise aware that such condemnation is pending or threatened, Seller shall immediately notify Buyer in writing of such fact, and Buyer may elect to (a) terminate this Agreement, (b) elect to proceed under this Agreement with any property taken by condemnation being excluded, or (c) proceed to close in which event Seller shall assign to Buyer all of Seller's interest in and to any condemnation award, regardless of whether such condemnation or taking applied to a material or immaterial portion of the Property. Buyer's election under this Paragraph shall be exercised by written notice to Seller within ten (10) days after receipt of written notice from Seller of its receipt of notice of such taking, or proposed taking, from the appropriate governmental or regulatory authority. If Buyer elects to close as provided above, Buyer shall be entitled to direct any condemnation proceedings utilizing counsel acceptable to Buyer. If Buyer elects to terminate this Agreement under this Paragraph, all Deposits paid hereunder shall be released to Buyer and there shall be no further rights, duties, or obligations of the parties hereunder (except for indemnification under Paragraph 7).
- 11. <u>Taxes and Assessments.</u> Real property taxes, water and sewer charges and rents, if any, shall be prorated and adjusted on the basis of thirty (30) days to each month, Seller to have the last day, to the date of Closing. Taxes for all prior years, including any rollback taxes, shall be paid by

Seller. If the Closing shall occur before the tax rate is fixed for the then-current year, the apportionment of taxes shall be upon the basis of the tax rate for the preceding year applied to the latest assessed valuation, with the proration to be adjusted between the parties based on actual taxes for the year in which Closing occurs at the time such actual taxes are determined. Assessments, either general or special, for improvements completed prior to the date of Closing, whether matured or unmatured, shall be paid in full by Seller. All other assessments shall be paid by Buyer. The provisions of this Paragraph 11 survive Closing.

12. <u>Closing.</u> The closing of this transaction shall be within 60 days of expiration of the Feasibility Period (including any extensions thereof as set forth in Paragraph 9 hereof (the "Closing"). The Closing shall be held in the offices ROCHELLE, McCULLOCH & AULDS, PLLC, at which time all papers legally required to carry out the terms of this Agreement shall be executed and delivered. Prorations shall be pursuant to the provisions of Paragraph 11 herein.

The conveyance of the Property shall be by General Warranty Deed, subject only to those matters set forth in the Commitment as accepted by Buyer.

Seller shall pay for:

- (i) the cost of any Tennessee transfer taxes;
- (ii) the cost of recording curative instruments, line releases, and any other documents, other than the Deed; and
- (iii) the cost of Seller's attorney's fees.

Buyer shall pay for:

- (i) the cost of any local recording fees associated with the deed;
- (ii) the cost of any title search fees and premiums for title insurance Buyer elects to obtain:
- (iii) the cost of Buyer's attorney's fees, settlement fees, and escrow fees; and
- (iv) the cost of all tests and inspections performed by or for Buyer.

Seller will deliver the following to Buyer at closing: (a) a certificate in a form satisfactory to Buyer which shall state that Seller is not a "foreign person" within the meaning of Sections 1445 and 7701 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended i.e., Seller is not a non-resident alien, foreign corporation, foreign partnership, foreign trust, or foreign estate (as such terms are defined therein and in the Internal Revenue Tax Regulations), (b) if required, all information necessary to

complete Internal Revenue Service Form 1099 with regard to this transaction, (c) proof of Seller's authority to convey the Property to Buyer sufficient to satisfy Buyer's counsel and the Title Company, (d) the General Warranty Deed, (e) an updated Commitment with "gap" coverage insuring against matters placed of record after the insuring time of the Commitment but prior to recordation of the deed, and (f) any other documents which Buyer reasonably deems necessary to carry out the intent of this Agreement.

Buyer shall deliver the following to Seller at Closing: proof of Buyer's authority to execute all documents related to the purchase of the Property from Seller sufficient to satisfy Seller's counsel and the Title Company.

Notices. All notices and other communications required or permitted to be given hereunder shall be in writing and shall be mailed by certified or registered mail, postage prepaid or by Federal Express, Airborne Express, or similar overnight delivery service, addressed as follows:

Notice shall be deemed to have been given upon deposit in the U.S. Mail or delivery to a nationally recognized overnight delivery service, as applicable.

- **14. Brokers.** Buyer and Seller each hereby represent that there are no brokers, agents, or finders involved or that have a right to proceeds in this transaction. This Section shall servive closing or the earlier termination of this Agreement.
- **Default and Remedies.** Should Buyer fail to perform any of its obligations under this Agreement within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice from Seller (or in the event of a monetary default, ten (10) days after receipt of written notice from Seller), then this Agreement shall terminate and receipt of the Deposit (to the extent paid by Buyer at the time of the default) shall be Seller's sole and exclusive remedy for such breach as liquidated damages. The parties hereto agree that the actual damages to Seller in the event of a Buyer default are impractical and difficult to ascertain and the Deposit amount is a reasonable estimate thereof.

Should Seller fail to perform any of its obligations under this Agreement within thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice from Buyer, then this Agreement shall terminate and a refund of the Deposit shall be Buyer's sole and exclusive remedy for such breach as liquidated damages. The parties hereto agree that the actual damages to Buyer in the event of a Seller default are impractical and difficult to ascertain and the Deposit amount is a reasonable estimate thereof.

Formal tender of an executed deed and purchase money is hereby waiver in order to declare default.

- **16. Time of Essence.** Time is expressly declared to be of the essence of this Agreement.
- 17. Entire Agreement; Counterparts. This Agreement (including the Exhibits attached hereto and Addenda, if any) contains the entire agreement between Seller and Buyer, and there are no other terms, conditions, promises, undertakings, statements or representations, express or implied, concerning the sale contemplation by this Agreement. This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which shall constitute one and the same Agreement. To facilitate execution and delivery of this Agreement, the parties may execute and exchange executed counterparts by facsimile or e-mail in a PDF file to the other party or to the other party's counsel. Facsimile or signatures in a PDF file shall have the same legal effect as original signatures.

- **18. Headings; Holidays.** The headings to the Sections hereof have been inserted for convenience of reference only and shall in no way modify or restrict any provisions hereof or be used to construe any such provisions. Whenever any time limit or date provided herein falls on a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, then that date is extended to the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or legal holiday.
- **19.** <u>Modifications.</u> The terms of this Agreement may not be amended, waived or terminated orally, and may only be amended, waived or terminated by an instrument in writing signed by both Seller and Buyer.
- **20.** Assignment. This Agreement may be assigned or transferred by Buyer upon the prior written consent of Seller, said consent not to be unreasonably withheld. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Buyer shall have the right to assign this Agreement to an affiliate or for financing purposes such as a land banking transaction.
- **21.** Successors. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and bind the parties hereto and their respective successors, heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns.
- **22. Survival.** The provisions of this Agreement shall survive the closing(s).
- **23. Applicable Law.** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed according to the laws of the state of Tennessee.
- **24. Escrow Agent.** Escrow Agent joins herein to acknowledge that by the execution of this Agreement, Escrow Agent agrees to hold Deposits in accordance with the terms hereof, subject to the following conditions and limitations:
- (a) In performing its duties hereunder, the Escrow Agent shall not incur liability to any party for damages, losses, or expenses, except for willful default or breach of trust. Accordingly, Escrow Agent shall not incur liability with respect to any action taken or omitted in reliance upon any instrument, including any written notice or instructions provided for in this Agreement, not only as to its due execution, and the validity and effectiveness of its provisions but also as to the truth and accuracy of any information contained therein which Escrow Agent shall, in good faith, believe to be genuine, to have been signed or presented by a proper person or persons and to conform with the provisions of this Agreement.
- (b) In the event of any dispute among the parties hereto, Escrow Agent may tender into the registry or custody of any court of competent jurisdiction all money or property in its hands under

this Agreement, together with such pleadings as it deems appropriate, and thereupon to be discharged from all further duties and liabilities under this Agreement.

- (c) Escrow Agent may consult with and obtain advice from legal counsel (other than counsel to any of the parties to this Agreement) in the event of any question as to any of the provisions of this Agreement or its duties thereunder, and it shall incur no liability and shall be fully protected in acting in good faith in accordance with the opinion and instructions of such counsel.
- **25.** Effective Date. The Effective Date of this Agreement shall be date of the last to execute this Agreement of Buyer and Seller.
- **26.** <u>Possession.</u> Possession of the Property shall be given at Closing. Seller shall vacate the property on the day of Closing. Any personal and real property left behind on the day of Closing by Seller will become the property of the Buyer and Seller will have no further rights to it after Closing.
- **Independent Consideration.** In any case in which the Deposit is provided herein to be returned to Buyer, then nevertheless One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) thereof shall be paid to or retained by Seller and deducted from the amount due Buyer. The Seller's amount shall belong to Seller in any and all events and shall in effect constitute option money, making this Agreement binding even if any conditions or provisions herein are entirely with the discretion or control of Buyer for certain time periods.
- **28.** <u>Post Closing Obligation of Buyer</u>. At Closing, Buyer agrees to enter an agreement with Seller that will require Purchaser as part of its development of the Property to build a trailhead and greenway connection on the Property at a location and of a type reasonably acceptable to Purchaser that upon completion will be dedicated to Seller for City of Mt. Juliet to maintain.

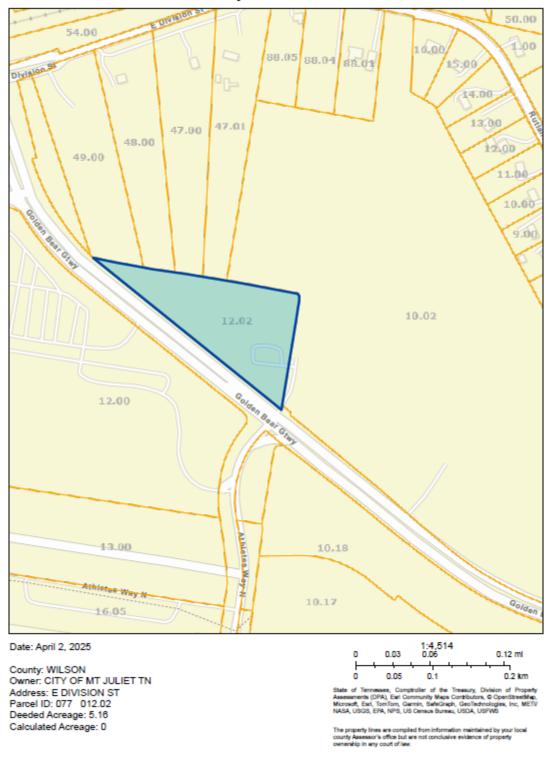

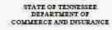

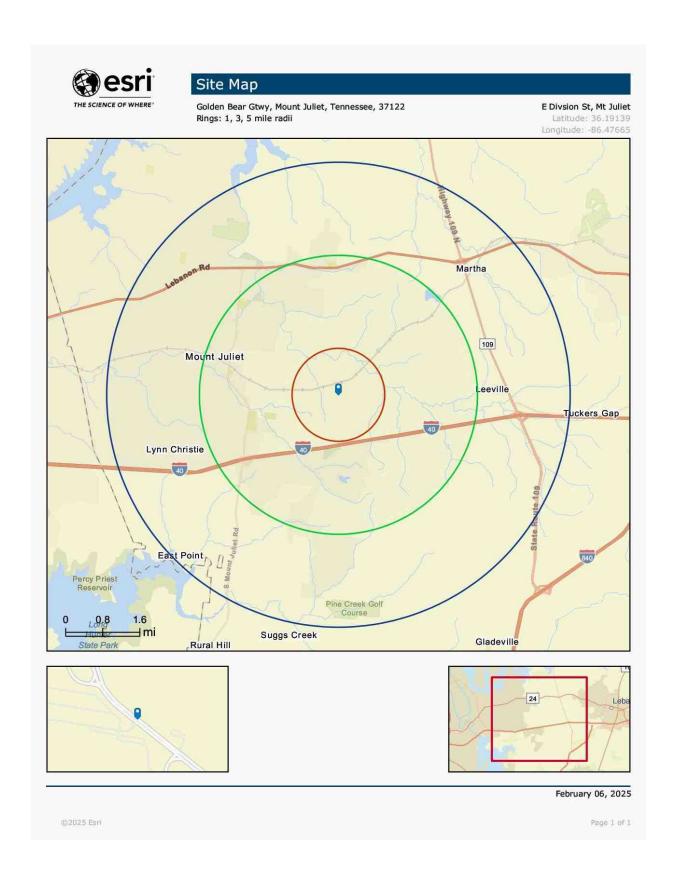

Request: Submitted by Barge Design Solutions, on behalf of Tulit Investments LLC, the applicant seeks a land use plan amendment, rezone and preliminary master development plan approval for a mixed-use commercial and residential development with 649 dwelling units and 102,132sf of commercial space on Golden Bear Gateway in District 3.

Overview: The subject property is 73.96 acres bounded by Golden Bear Gateway to the west, Division Street to the north and Rutland Drive to the east and is located wholly within the City limits. Proposed for the site is a mixed-use PUD with two base zoning districts and a mix of commercial space and residential product. The proposed residential density, overall, for the PUD is 8.78 units/ acre. Commercial space provided in the PUD is 102,132 gross square feet. A summary of the land use plan and zoning changes requested is provided below:

<u>Future Land Use Plan:</u> The City's future land use map identifies the entire property as mixed use. The applicant is seeking a land use plan amendment for 27.17 acres to single family residential for the construction of single-family homes in a portion of the PUD. The land use plan does not support the request.

<u>Zoning</u>: The zoning is presently OPS, OPS-PUD and RS-40. The applicant is seeking CMU zoning for 46.74 acres and RS-10 for 27.17 acres of the PUD.

<u>Findings:</u> In reviewing the requested zoning actions, staff finds that the request DOES NOT agree with all of the following findings, as contained in the zoning ordinance. The proposed annexation and rezone:

- 1. IS NOT agreement with the general plan for the area, and LAND USE PLAN
- 2. does not contravene the legal purposes for which zoning exists, and
- 3. will have no adverse effect upon joining property owners, unless such effect can be justified by the overwhelming public good or welfare, and
- 4. is not materially beneficial to a property owner or small group of property owners and will not be detrimental to the general public, and
- 5. is possible because conditions affecting the area have changed to a sufficient extent to warrant an amendment to the zoning map, and
- 6. allows uses by right, for which the base infrastructure is in place or will be required, to support their operation.

Preliminary Master Development Plan:

6-102a Bulk Standards: The total acreage of the proposed development is 73.96 acres, exceeding the minimum required for multifamily developments (20ac) and the proposed residential density is 8.78 units/acre, below the maximum permitted for the requested CMU zoning district (16.1 ac). The multi-family/commercial portion of the PUD includes a residential density of 12.52 units/acre and 102,132 sf of commercial space. The single-family component has a density of 2.32 units/acre (63 lots). The phasing plan includes 9 phases. The estimated population is not provided; the total number of residential units is 649.

1 bedroom: 290 2 bedroom: 109 3 bedroom: 29 Townhomes: 158 Single family: 63

Mixed use developments are held to the residential bulk regulations of RM-16. Average lot size for the single family, RS-10, component is 8,054sf, the smallest being 6,060sf and the largest 12,590. The City's minimum and average lot size ordinance applies to residential PUDs only, not mixed-use PUDs.

<u>6-104.1 Mixed-Use Regulations:</u> 35.39 acres of the PUD are slated for commercial use (48% of the land area of the PUD) 25% is required per the requirements of ordinance 22-51 approved in October 2022, the project exceeds the minimum. While the square footage of commercial for the PUD is identified the particular uses are not, except for a big box store.

<u>Streets/Sidewalks/Access:</u> The sidewalk network looks complete, further review will occur at subsequent submittals. There are vehicular access points along each of the project's road frontages, Rutland Drive, GBG and Division.

<u>Parking:</u> Parking appears to be adequately accommodated; further review will occur with subsequent submittals. A shared parking arrangement between nighttime and daytime uses for up to 25% of the required mixed-use area parking is requested and subject to Planning Commission approval.

Amenities: Amenities proposed include: a relocated GBG trailhead, dog parks, trails, unprogrammed open space, splash pad, town square, pool, outdoor grilling space, fire pit, business center, fitness center, golf simulator, co-working space, coffee lounge, cabanas, etc. Open space totals 22.55 acres of the PUD, or 30%.

<u>Multi-family and Commercial Building Design Standards:</u> Renderings are supplied to illustrate the overall appearance of the PUD. Façade material and other design standard waivers are outlined below and are subject to recommendation and approval by the Board of Commissioners. Elevations will be required with subsequent submittals.

<u>Article X Landscaping:</u> The applicant is not requesting any variance or waivers from the requirements of article X. A full landscape plan will be required and reviewed upon submittal of site plans and preliminary plats.

<u>Waivers/Variances:</u> The following waivers are requested:

- 1. 5-104.4 Access streets to allow front load garages with decorative doors STAFF DOES NOT SUPPORT
- 2. 4-104.401 33 single family homes on a cul-de-sac (14 max.) PW TO RECOMMEND
- 3. 5-103a Single family bulk regulations as follows:
 - a. Front setback 20' (30') PZ SUPPORTS
 - b. Side setback 7.5' (8') PZ DOES NOT SUPPORT
 - c. Min. lot width 50' (60') PZ SUPPORTS
 - d. Lot coverage: 50% (35%) PZ SUPPORTS
- 4. 12-102 Disturb slopes 20% or greater in a cut condition only PUBLIC WORKS TO RECOMMEND
- 5. 5-104a.4 Omit perimeter fence around multifamily PZ SUPPORTS
- 6. 6-103.3 Max. height of 55' The development site is approximately a mile from the I-40/GBG interchange, outside of the ½ mile required for additional height. PZ DOES NOT SUPPORT
- 7. 5-104.4 Less than 22' long driveways for alley loaded and front-loaded townhomes PZ DOES NOT SUPPORT
- 8. 4-114.1 50% masonry, 50% secondary Hardie and board and batten for multi family PZ SUPPORTS 70% MASONRY AND 30% SECONDARY

<u>Summary:</u> This PUD will add 649 residential units, 102,132 square feet of commercial space and associated improvements to the Golden Bear Gateway/E. Division area in District 3. The future land use does not support the rezone request for single family residential.

Staff does not support the townhomes against Golden Bear Gateway as proposed, as this is a major commercial corridor in the City, this area should be developed with commercial uses along this frontage in lieu of residential.

The waivers and variances detailed above are subject to Planning Commission and Board of Commissioners approval. Full compliance with code is required, excepting any waivers or variances granted. Many of the conditions below are addressed with notes indicating compliance with many of the City's requirements.

Recommendation: Should the Planning Commission make a positive recommendation to the Board of Commissioners for the land use amendment, rezone and preliminary master development plan for the Sutton on Golden Bear Gateway, please include the following conditions:

Planning and Zoning:

- 1. Live/work spaces are not permitted to contribute to commercial square footage.
- 2. Amenities may not contribute to commercial square footage.
- 3. Provide landscaped islands every 15 parking spaces.
- 4. All requirements of the City's Subdivision regulations shall be adhered to, except any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 5. 5-104.1 Multifamily guidelines shall be adhered to, excepting any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 6. 6-104.1 Mixed-use regulations shall be adhered to, excepting any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 7. 5-104.4 Single family guidelines shall be adhered to excepting any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 8. Exterior lighting fixtures mounted to the buildings shall be decorative. Wall packs are not permitted.
- 9. All poles and posts throughout the PUD shall be powder-coated black, channel posts are not permitted.
- 10. Bollards shall not be painted yellow; rather black gray or another neutral color.
- 11. Wheel stops are not permitted.
- 12. Corner lots and edge units shall be designated critical façade lots.
- 13. All fencing shall be decorative and constructed of low maintenance material.
- 14. HVAC and utility equipment shall be screened entirely from horizontal view by parapet walls if roof mounted and masonry enclosure or landscaping if ground mounted.
- 15. Wall mounted utility meters and associated equipment shall be painted to match the façade it is attached to.

- 16. Metal and vinyl shall not be permitted as secondary façade materials.
- 17. Brick shall be clay, baked and individually laid.
- 18. Stone shall be individually laid.
- 19. Wet ponds shall have lighted fountains for aeration and landscaping around the perimeter.
- 20. Preserve as many trees as possible. Should existing vegetation be utilized for required landscaping provide a tree survey at final master development plan submittal.
- 21. Provide bike racks per code.
- 22. Provide trash receptacles per code.
- 23. Fire pits shall be set in a brick or stone base.
- 24. Dumpster enclosure and trash compactors shall be faced with masonry and meet the requirements of 6-103.7, regulations for dumpster enclosures.
- 25. 2,000sf of clubhouse area, up to 200 units, is required, plus 10sf per each additional dwelling in multifamily areas per multi-family regulations.
- 26. Provide commercial and/or mixed uses along the entire Golden Bear Gateway frontage in lieu of the townhomes/strictly residential as this is a major commercial corridor in the City.
- 27. Detention ponds, easements, etc. shall not be counted towards improved open space requirements.
- 28. Provide decorative streetlighting at the entrances and throughout the PUD per recently approved ordinance 2025-24.
- 29. Parking lot lighting shall be decorative fixtures mounted to black poles. Poles shall be placed in landscaped areas or yards not in the parking lot.
- 30. Paint wall mounted utility equipment and meters to match the building façade it is attached to.
- 31. Landscape buffers shall be located in open space and not on individual lots. The HOA or management company shall be responsible for the maintenance of all buffers.
- 32. Mail kiosks shall be covered, lighted and include designated parking.
- 33. Signage to be reviewed via a separate application to the Planning Department.
- 34. The full complement of required parking shall be required if the 25% share request is not approved by the Planning Commission.

Engineering:

- 1. This PMDP shall be stamped, signed, and dated by a TN registered engineer for all future submittals.
- 2. In the event karst features are encountered during grading, a licensed geotechnical engineer shall document the feature, and the feature shall be located by a licensed surveyor. If the feature is to be remediated, the geotechnical engineer shall provide a remediation plan to the City for approval. Efforts will be made to minimize any remediated features within building envelopes.
- 3. Do not install EPSC measures in existing landscaping being preserved as a buffer.
- 4. Landscaping plans shall be approved prior to the issuance of the Land Disturbance Permit.
- 5. If wet ponds are used, aeration shall be provided.
- 6. Stormwater: Rule 400-10-.04 need at construction plans, 100-year storm for detention.
- 7. A letter of approval from West Wilson Utility District will be required prior to construction plan approval is issued.
- 8. Grinder systems or on-site step systems will not be allowed for this development.
- 9. The internal pump station shall be public and designed to City standards.

- 10. All sewer mains (minus laterals) shall be public and within a 20'(minimum) easement.
- 11. The public sewer shall not be placed within private alleys.
- 12. Sewer availability has been granted. The developer shall upsize the existing gravity sewers to accommodate the flow from the development's discharge point (at the existing manhole) to the Volunteer (7-Eleven) pump station. Sizing parameters shall be determined at construction plan review.
- 13. Offsite sewer shall not be under the greenway. Alignment of the sewer shall be determined at the FMDP.
- 14. Provide hydrologic determination by FMDP.
- 15. Variances:
 - Request to disturb slopes more than 20% Staff supports in a cut condition only.
 - Request to allow front loading garages on access streets (Zoning Reg 5-104.4.10)
 Not supported.
 - Request to allow more than 14 lots on a cul-de-sac (Sub Reg 4-104.401) Supported conditionally that the street include 24' of pavement.
 - Request to allow up to 25% shared parking (Zoning Reg 9-103) **Not supported** without a shared parking analysis.
 - Request to allow permanent dead ends to terminate within 150' of the property boundary (Sub Reg 4-104.405) **Supported**
 - Request to allow residential frontages on a collector (Sub Reg 4-104.303) –
 Supported on one side of the street with shared driveways. No lots may have individual driveways along the collector
 - Request to waive sidewalk requirements in areas with environmental impacts (Sub Reg 4-103.102) **Not Supported**
 - Request for the greenway to be a mulch trail **Not Supported**
- 16. The following off-site improvements will be required based on the results of the MTA:
 - a. Golden Bear Gateway and Rutland Drive
 - i. A traffic signal should be installed at this intersection when warranted. A signal warrant analysis should be submitted with each FMDP/Site of a commercial parcel or final plat (residential). The median on Golden Bear Gateway and Athletes Way shall be closed when the signal is installed.
 - ii. The southbound approach of Rutland Drive should be widened to include an exclusive left-turn lane. This improvement should be done prior to the construction of the project entrance on Rutland Drive.
 - b. Golden Bear Gateway and E. Division Ramp/Site access
 - i. The site access at this intersection shall be right-in/right-out only. The median on Golden Bear Gateway shall be modified to allow lefts onto and off of the ramp, but not into the site.
 - ii. This may require the site access location be moved.
 - c. Golden Bear Gateway Signals
 - i. A time-of-day and coordination plan shall be developed for all signals between Division Street and Summit Boulevard. This plan shall be implemented prior to the opening of 50% of the commercial area or the installation of the signal at Rutland Drive, whichever occurs first.
 - ii. Opticom preemption with a perpetual license shall be installed at all signals between Division Street and Summit Boulevard.
- 17. Site Access

- a. Site Access 1 shall be located on Golden Bear Gateway at the signalized intersection at Athletes Way. This approach shall include protected/permissive left-turn phasing and run concurrently with the Athletes Way approach.
- b. Site Access 2 shall be located on Rutland Drive. A left-turn lane should be installed on Rutland Drive at the intersection. This driveway must meet HSAM spacing requirements.
- c. Site Access 3, as proposed on Rutland Drive, does not meet HSAM spacing requirements and therefore is not supported. However, capacity analysis indicated the driveway to be located outside the queue from a signal at Rutland Drive and Golden Bear Gateway.
- d. Site Access 4 shall be located on Golden Bear Gateway, opposite the Project Jolene driveway. This driveway shall be right-in/right-out only and a median shall be installed along Golden Bear Gateway.
- e. Site Access 5 shall be located on Golden Bear Gateway, opposite the Division Street ramp. This driveway shall be right-in/right-out only. The median on Golden Bear Gateway shall be modified to allow lefts onto and off of the ramp, but not into the site. This may require the location of the driveway be changed.
- f. Site Access 6 shall be located on East Division Street and include left-turn and right-turn lanes on Division Street. This driveway must meet HSAM spacing requirements to Golden Bear Gateway and Rutland Drive.
- g. Site Access 7 shall be located on Rutland Drive and meet HSAM spacing requirements from Division Street.
- 18. Sidewalks are required along all road frontage.
- 19. Pedestrian Access Routes (PAR) are required from the ROW to all businesses per ADA standards.
- 20. All roads serving the multifamily and commercial portions of the site shall be private. The central spine collector shall be a minor collector if public, and adhere to all design standards, widths, and access standards of a minor collector cross-section.
- 21. Sidewalks adjacent to perpendicular parking shall be at least 7' wide to account for vehicle overhang.
- 22. Sidewalks adjacent to parallel parking shall be at least 6' wide, excluding the width of the curb, to account for mirrors and doors.
- 23. All shared use paths must be at least 10' wide.

Juliet Board of Commissioners desires to rezone the subject property known as the Sutton, located on Golden Bear Gateway, map 072, parcels 047.00, 047.01, 048.00 & 049.00, map 077, parcels 010.02, 011.01, & 012.02, from OPS, OPS-PUD and RS-40 to CMU-PUD and RS-10-PUD and to adopt the Preliminary Master Development Plan for a mixed use development.

Section 1. REZONING. Resolution No. 20-2022 (Zoning Map), adopted March 28, 2022, be and is hereby amended, and altered by rezoning those certain parcels of real property known as the Sutton, located on Golden Bear Gateway, map 072, parcels 047.00, 047.01, 048.00 & 049.00, map 077, parcels 010.02, 011.01, & 012.02, from OPS, OPS-PUD and RS-40 to CMU-PUD and RS-10-PUD (Exhibit B).

LEGAL DESCRIPTION – See Exhibit A (attached)

Section 2. The Preliminary Master Development Plan for the Sutton (Exhibit B) is hereby adopted, except as modified herein. The Preliminary Master Development Plan shall comply with the Zoning Ordinance, be in substantial conformance with all other applicable rules, regulations and ordinances of the City of Mt. Juliet and is further conditioned upon the following:

Planning and Zoning:

1. Live/work spaces are not permitted to contribute to commercial square footage.

- 2. Amenities may not contribute to commercial square footage.
- 3. Provide landscaped islands every 15 parking spaces.
- 4. All requirements of the City's Subdivision regulations shall be adhered to, except any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 5. 5-104.1 Multifamily guidelines shall be adhered to, excepting any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 6. 6-104.1 Mixed-use regulations shall be adhered to, excepting any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 7. 5-104.4 Single family guidelines shall be adhered to excepting any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 8. Exterior lighting fixtures mounted to the buildings shall be decorative. Wall packs are not permitted.
- 9. All poles and posts throughout the PUD shall be powder-coated black, channel posts are not permitted.
- 10. Bollards shall not be painted yellow; rather black gray or another neutral color.
- 11. Wheel stops are not permitted.
- 12. Corner lots and edge units shall be designated critical façade lots.
- 13. All fencing shall be decorative and constructed of low maintenance material.
- 14. HVAC and utility equipment shall be screened entirely from horizontal view by parapet walls if roof mounted and masonry enclosure or landscaping if ground mounted.
- 15. Wall mounted utility meters and associated equipment shall be painted to match the façade it is attached to.
- 16. Metal and vinyl shall not be permitted as secondary façade materials.
- 17. Brick shall be clay, baked and individually laid.
- 18. Stone shall be individually laid.
- 19. Wet ponds shall have lighted fountains for aeration and landscaping around the perimeter.
- 20. Preserve as many trees as possible. Should existing vegetation be utilized for required landscaping provide a tree survey at final master development plan submittal.
- 21. Provide bike racks per code.
- 22. Provide trash receptacles per code.
- 23. Fire pits shall be set in a brick or stone base.
- 24. Dumpster enclosure and trash compactors shall be faced with masonry and meet the requirements of 6-103.7, regulations for dumpster enclosures.
- 25. 2,000sf of clubhouse area, up to 200 units, is required, plus 10sf per each additional dwelling in multifamily areas per multi-family regulations.
- 26. Provide commercial and/or mixed uses along the entire Golden Bear Gateway frontage in lieu of the townhomes/strictly residential as this is a major commercial corridor in the City.
- 27. Detention ponds, easements, etc. shall not be counted towards improved open space requirements.
- 28. Provide decorative streetlighting at the entrances and throughout the PUD per recently approved ordinance 2025-24.
- 29. Parking lot lighting shall be decorative fixtures mounted to black poles. Poles shall be placed in landscaped areas or yards not in the parking lot.
- 30. Paint wall mounted utility equipment and meters to match the building façade it is attached to.
- 31. Landscape buffers shall be located in open space and not on individual lots. The HOA or management company shall be responsible for the maintenance of all buffers.
- 32. Mail kiosks shall be covered, lighted and include designated parking.

- 33. Signage to be reviewed via a separate application to the Planning Department.
- 34. The full complement of required parking shall be required if the 25% share request is not approved by the Planning Commission.

- 41. The Board of Commissioners granted a waiver to allow the garage door to exceed 50% of the front façade if a decorative garage door is used.
- 42. The Board of Commissioners approved a waiver to allow the garage doors to be flush with the front façade.
- 43. The Board of Commissioners approved a waiver to allow a grocery store of less than 20,000sf in area.
- 44. The Board of Commissioners granted a waiver to allow up to 15% shared parking in the mixed-use areas.

Engineering:

- 1. This PMDP shall be stamped, signed, and dated by a TN registered engineer for all future submittals.

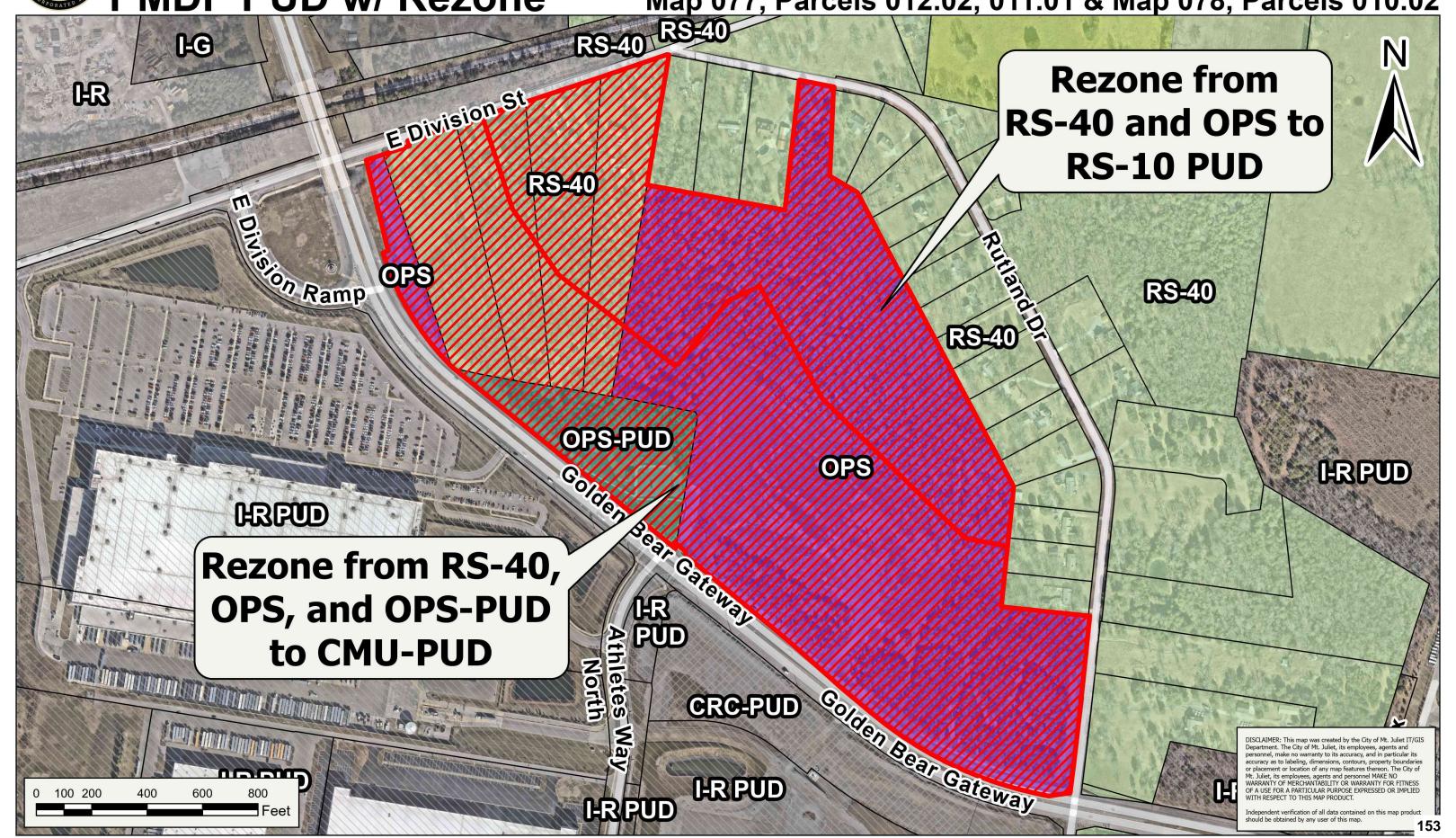

Request: Submitted by Barge Design Solutions, on behalf of Tulit Investments LLC, the applicant seeks a land use plan amendment, rezone and preliminary master development plan approval for a mixed-use commercial and residential development with 649 dwelling units and 102,132sf of commercial space on Golden Bear Gateway in District 3.

Overview: The subject property is 73.96 acres bounded by Golden Bear Gateway to the west, Division Street to the north and Rutland Drive to the east and is located wholly within the City limits. Proposed for the site is a mixed-use PUD with two base zoning districts and a mix of commercial space and residential product. The proposed residential density, overall, for the PUD is 8.78 units/ acre. Commercial space provided in the PUD is 102,132 gross square feet. A summary of the land use plan and zoning changes requested is provided below:

<u>Future Land Use Plan:</u> The City's future land use map identifies the entire property as mixed use. The applicant is seeking a land use plan amendment for 27.17 acres to single family residential for the construction of single-family homes in a portion of the PUD. The land use plan does not support the request.

<u>Zoning</u>: The zoning is presently OPS, OPS-PUD and RS-40. The applicant is seeking CMU zoning for 46.74 acres and RS-10 for 27.17 acres of the PUD.

<u>Findings:</u> In reviewing the requested zoning actions, staff finds that the request DOES NOT agree with all of the following findings, as contained in the zoning ordinance. The proposed annexation and rezone:

- 1. IS NOT agreement with the general plan for the area, and LAND USE PLAN
- 2. does not contravene the legal purposes for which zoning exists, and
- 3. will have no adverse effect upon joining property owners, unless such effect can be justified by the overwhelming public good or welfare, and
- 4. is not materially beneficial to a property owner or small group of property owners and will not be detrimental to the general public, and
- 5. is possible because conditions affecting the area have changed to a sufficient extent to warrant an amendment to the zoning map, and
- 6. allows uses by right, for which the base infrastructure is in place or will be required, to support their operation.

Preliminary Master Development Plan:

6-102a Bulk Standards: The total acreage of the proposed development is 73.96 acres, exceeding the minimum required for multifamily developments (20ac) and the proposed residential density is 8.78 units/acre, below the maximum permitted for the requested CMU zoning district (16.1 ac). The multi-family/commercial portion of the PUD includes a residential density of 12.52 units/acre and 102,132 sf of commercial space. The single-family component has a density of 2.32 units/acre (63 lots). The phasing plan includes 9 phases. The estimated population is not provided; the total number of residential units is 649.

1 bedroom: 290 2 bedroom: 109 3 bedroom: 29 Townhomes: 158 Single family: 63

Mixed use developments are held to the residential bulk regulations of RM-16. Average lot size for the single family, RS-10, component is 8,054sf, the smallest being 6,060sf and the largest 12,590. The City's minimum and average lot size ordinance applies to residential PUDs only, not mixed-use PUDs.

<u>6-104.1 Mixed-Use Regulations:</u> 35.39 acres of the PUD are slated for commercial use (48% of the land area of the PUD) 25% is required per the requirements of ordinance 22-51 approved in October 2022, the project exceeds the minimum. While the square footage of commercial for the PUD is identified the particular uses are not, except for a big box store.

<u>Streets/Sidewalks/Access:</u> The sidewalk network looks complete, further review will occur at subsequent submittals. There are vehicular access points along each of the project's road frontages, Rutland Drive, GBG and Division.

<u>Parking:</u> Parking appears to be adequately accommodated; further review will occur with subsequent submittals. A shared parking arrangement between nighttime and daytime uses for up to 25% of the required mixed-use area parking is requested and subject to Planning Commission approval.

<u>Amenities:</u> Amenities proposed include: a relocated GBG trailhead, dog parks, trails, unprogrammed open space, splash pad, town square, pool, outdoor grilling space, fire pit, business center, fitness center, golf simulator, co-working space, coffee lounge, cabanas, etc. Open space totals 22.55 acres of the PUD, or 30%.

<u>Multi-family and Commercial Building Design Standards:</u> Renderings are supplied to illustrate the overall appearance of the PUD. Façade material and other design standard waivers are outlined below and are subject to recommendation and approval by the Board of Commissioners. Elevations will be required with subsequent submittals.

<u>Article X Landscaping:</u> The applicant is not requesting any variance or waivers from the requirements of article X. A full landscape plan will be required and reviewed upon submittal of site plans and preliminary plats.

<u>Waivers/Variances:</u> The following waivers are requested:

- 1. 5-104.4 Access streets to allow front load garages with decorative doors STAFF DOES NOT SUPPORT
- 2. 4-104.401 33 single family homes on a cul-de-sac (14 max.) PW TO RECOMMEND
- 3. 5-103a Single family bulk regulations as follows:
 - a. Front setback 20' (30') PZ SUPPORTS
 - b. Side setback 7.5' (8') PZ DOES NOT SUPPORT
 - c. Min. lot width 50' (60') PZ SUPPORTS
 - d. Lot coverage: 50% (35%) PZ SUPPORTS
- 4. 12-102 Disturb slopes 20% or greater in a cut condition only PUBLIC WORKS TO RECOMMEND
- 5. 5-104a.4 Omit perimeter fence around multifamily PZ SUPPORTS
- 6. 6-103.3 Max. height of 55' The development site is approximately a mile from the I-40/GBG interchange, outside of the ½ mile required for additional height. PZ DOES NOT SUPPORT
- 7. 5-104.4 Less than 22' long driveways for alley loaded and front-loaded townhomes PZ DOES NOT SUPPORT
- 8. 4-114.1 50% masonry, 50% secondary Hardie and board and batten for multi family PZ SUPPORTS 70% MASONRY AND 30% SECONDARY
- 9. 5-104.4 50% masonry, 50% secondary Hardie and board and batten for single family PZ SUPPORTS 70% MASONRY AND 30% SECONDARY

- 16. 6-103.7.3 Omit sidewalks in areas that require environment impact PZ DOES NOT SUPPORT
- 17. 6-103.4 Allow townhome balconies to encroach into yards PZ SUPPORTS
- 18. 8-207.5.4 Greenway trail to be mulched in lieu of paved PZ DOES NOT SUPPORT

<u>Summary:</u> This PUD will add 649 residential units, 102,132 square feet of commercial space and associated improvements to the Golden Bear Gateway/E. Division area in District 3. The future land use does not support the rezone request for single family residential.

Staff does not support the townhomes against Golden Bear Gateway as proposed, as this is a major commercial corridor in the City, this area should be developed with commercial uses along this frontage in lieu of residential.

The waivers and variances detailed above are subject to Planning Commission and Board of Commissioners approval. Full compliance with code is required, excepting any waivers or variances granted. Many of the conditions below are addressed with notes indicating compliance with many of the City's requirements.

Recommendation: Should the Planning Commission make a positive recommendation to the Board of Commissioners for the land use amendment, rezone and preliminary master development plan for the Sutton on Golden Bear Gateway, please include the following conditions:

Planning and Zoning:

- 1. Live/work spaces are not permitted to contribute to commercial square footage.
- 2. Amenities may not contribute to commercial square footage.
- 3. Provide landscaped islands every 15 parking spaces.
- 4. All requirements of the City's Subdivision regulations shall be adhered to, except any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 5. 5-104.1 Multifamily guidelines shall be adhered to, excepting any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 6. 6-104.1 Mixed-use regulations shall be adhered to, excepting any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 7. 5-104.4 Single family guidelines shall be adhered to excepting any waivers approved by the Board of Commissioners.
- 8. Exterior lighting fixtures mounted to the buildings shall be decorative. Wall packs are not permitted.
- 9. All poles and posts throughout the PUD shall be powder-coated black, channel posts are not permitted.
- 10. Bollards shall not be painted yellow; rather black gray or another neutral color.
- 11. Wheel stops are not permitted.
- 12. Corner lots and edge units shall be designated critical façade lots.
- 13. All fencing shall be decorative and constructed of low maintenance material.
- 14. HVAC and utility equipment shall be screened entirely from horizontal view by parapet walls if roof mounted and masonry enclosure or landscaping if ground mounted.
- 15. Wall mounted utility meters and associated equipment shall be painted to match the façade it is attached to.

- 16. Metal and vinyl shall not be permitted as secondary façade materials.
- 17. Brick shall be clay, baked and individually laid.
- 18. Stone shall be individually laid.
- 19. Wet ponds shall have lighted fountains for aeration and landscaping around the perimeter.
- 20. Preserve as many trees as possible. Should existing vegetation be utilized for required landscaping provide a tree survey at final master development plan submittal.
- 21. Provide bike racks per code.
- 22. Provide trash receptacles per code.
- 23. Fire pits shall be set in a brick or stone base.
- 24. Dumpster enclosure and trash compactors shall be faced with masonry and meet the requirements of 6-103.7, regulations for dumpster enclosures.
- 25. 2,000sf of clubhouse area, up to 200 units, is required, plus 10sf per each additional dwelling in multifamily areas per multi-family regulations.
- 26. Provide commercial and/or mixed uses along the entire Golden Bear Gateway frontage in lieu of the townhomes/strictly residential as this is a major commercial corridor in the City.
- 27. Detention ponds, easements, etc. shall not be counted towards improved open space requirements.
- 28. Provide decorative streetlighting at the entrances and throughout the PUD per recently approved ordinance 2025-24.
- 29. Parking lot lighting shall be decorative fixtures mounted to black poles. Poles shall be placed in landscaped areas or yards not in the parking lot.
- 30. Paint wall mounted utility equipment and meters to match the building façade it is attached to.
- 31. Landscape buffers shall be located in open space and not on individual lots. The HOA or management company shall be responsible for the maintenance of all buffers.
- 32. Mail kiosks shall be covered, lighted and include designated parking.
- 33. Signage to be reviewed via a separate application to the Planning Department.
- 34. The full complement of required parking shall be required if the 25% share request is not approved by the Planning Commission.

Engineering:

- 1. This PMDP shall be stamped, signed, and dated by a TN registered engineer for all future submittals.
- 2. In the event karst features are encountered during grading, a licensed geotechnical engineer shall document the feature, and the feature shall be located by a licensed surveyor. If the feature is to be remediated, the geotechnical engineer shall provide a remediation plan to the City for approval. Efforts will be made to minimize any remediated features within building envelopes.
- 3. Do not install EPSC measures in existing landscaping being preserved as a buffer.
- 4. Landscaping plans shall be approved prior to the issuance of the Land Disturbance Permit.
- 5. If wet ponds are used, aeration shall be provided.
- 6. Stormwater: Rule 400-10-.04 need at construction plans, 100-year storm for detention.
- 7. A letter of approval from West Wilson Utility District will be required prior to construction plan approval is issued.
- 8. Grinder systems or on-site step systems will not be allowed for this development.
- 9. The internal pump station shall be public and designed to City standards.

- 10. All sewer mains (minus laterals) shall be public and within a 20'(minimum) easement.
- 11. The public sewer shall not be placed within private alleys.
- 12. Sewer availability has been granted. The developer shall upsize the existing gravity sewers to accommodate the flow from the development's discharge point (at the existing manhole) to the Volunteer (7-Eleven) pump station. Sizing parameters shall be determined at construction plan review.
- 13. Offsite sewer shall not be under the greenway. Alignment of the sewer shall be determined at the FMDP.
- 14. Provide hydrologic determination by FMDP.
- 15. Variances:
 - Request to disturb slopes more than 20% Staff supports in a cut condition only.
 - Request to allow front loading garages on access streets (Zoning Reg 5-104.4.10)
 Not supported.
 - Request to allow more than 14 lots on a cul-de-sac (Sub Reg 4-104.401) Supported conditionally that the street include 24' of pavement.
 - Request to allow up to 25% shared parking (Zoning Reg 9-103) **Not supported** without a shared parking analysis.
 - Request to allow permanent dead ends to terminate within 150' of the property boundary (Sub Reg 4-104.405) **Supported**
 - Request to allow residential frontages on a collector (Sub Reg 4-104.303) –
 Supported on one side of the street with shared driveways. No lots may have individual driveways along the collector
 - Request to waive sidewalk requirements in areas with environmental impacts (Sub Reg 4-103.102) **Not Supported**
 - Request for the greenway to be a mulch trail **Not Supported**
- 16. The following off-site improvements will be required based on the results of the MTA:
 - a. Golden Bear Gateway and Rutland Drive
 - i. A traffic signal should be installed at this intersection when warranted. A signal warrant analysis should be submitted with each FMDP/Site of a commercial parcel or final plat (residential). The median on Golden Bear Gateway and Athletes Way shall be closed when the signal is installed.
 - ii. The southbound approach of Rutland Drive should be widened to include an exclusive left-turn lane. This improvement should be done prior to the construction of the project entrance on Rutland Drive.
 - b. Golden Bear Gateway and E. Division Ramp/Site access
 - i. The site access at this intersection shall be right-in/right-out only. The median on Golden Bear Gateway shall be modified to allow lefts onto and off of the ramp, but not into the site.
 - ii. This may require the site access location be moved.
 - c. Golden Bear Gateway Signals
 - i. A time-of-day and coordination plan shall be developed for all signals between Division Street and Summit Boulevard. This plan shall be implemented prior to the opening of 50% of the commercial area or the installation of the signal at Rutland Drive, whichever occurs first.
 - ii. Opticom preemption with a perpetual license shall be installed at all signals between Division Street and Summit Boulevard.
- 17. Site Access

- a. Site Access 1 shall be located on Golden Bear Gateway at the signalized intersection at Athletes Way. This approach shall include protected/permissive left-turn phasing and run concurrently with the Athletes Way approach.
- b. Site Access 2 shall be located on Rutland Drive. A left-turn lane should be installed on Rutland Drive at the intersection. This driveway must meet HSAM spacing requirements.
- c. Site Access 3, as proposed on Rutland Drive, does not meet HSAM spacing requirements and therefore is not supported. However, capacity analysis indicated the driveway to be located outside the queue from a signal at Rutland Drive and Golden Bear Gateway.
- d. Site Access 4 shall be located on Golden Bear Gateway, opposite the Project Jolene driveway. This driveway shall be right-in/right-out only and a median shall be installed along Golden Bear Gateway.
- e. Site Access 5 shall be located on Golden Bear Gateway, opposite the Division Street ramp. This driveway shall be right-in/right-out only. The median on Golden Bear Gateway shall be modified to allow lefts onto and off of the ramp, but not into the site. This may require the location of the driveway be changed.
- f. Site Access 6 shall be located on East Division Street and include left-turn and right-turn lanes on Division Street. This driveway must meet HSAM spacing requirements to Golden Bear Gateway and Rutland Drive.
- g. Site Access 7 shall be located on Rutland Drive and meet HSAM spacing requirements from Division Street.
- 18. Sidewalks are required along all road frontage.
- 19. Pedestrian Access Routes (PAR) are required from the ROW to all businesses per ADA standards.
- 20. All roads serving the multifamily and commercial portions of the site shall be private. The central spine collector shall be a minor collector if public, and adhere to all design standards, widths, and access standards of a minor collector cross-section.
- 21. Sidewalks adjacent to perpendicular parking shall be at least 7' wide to account for vehicle overhang.
- 22. Sidewalks adjacent to parallel parking shall be at least 6' wide, excluding the width of the curb, to account for mirrors and doors.
- 23. All shared use paths must be at least 10' wide.
- 24. The shared use path along Golden Bear Gateway shall be moved in front of the signage at the signal to provide better lines of sight to turning motorists and to prevent bicycles and pedestrians crossing through the vehicle queues.
- 25. The alleys within the townhome areas shall include at least 20' of pavement.
- 26. Perpendicular parking on the alleys must comply with the parking dimensions provided in the Zoning Ordinances. Consider angled parking to reduce the required drive aisle width.
- 27. All sidewalks on the collector between E. Division Street and Rutland Drive shall be at least 6' wide. Sidewalks are required on both sides of the street over the stream crossing.

The Executive Department will be hiring a new Deputy City Manager due to an upcoming retirement. To prepare for this transition the Department recently compared the salary ranges of Deputy City Managers and City Managers across cities of comparable size. The following cities and pay rates were used for comparison.

The current salary range for the City Manager position was found to be 29.3% below the average. The Executive Department requests to increase the City Manager pay by 8.9%, from \$87.20 to \$95.00. This will require a contract amendment which will be included on second reading.

Currently the Deputy City Manager position is combined with the City Recorder. This adjustment will create a pay scale for the new position of Deputy City Manager. The average salary for a Deputy City Manager in Middle TN is \$100.56. The Executive Department is recommending a pay rate for the newly created Deputy City Manager position at \$82.00.

The estimated additional funding needed for all personnel costs including salary, taxes, retirement etc. is \$69,000 for the current fiscal year. This is broken down by an additional \$58,000 for the Deputy City Manager position and \$11,000 for the City Manager position. In reviewing the budget, it was noted that the Police Department has vacant positions that have not yet been filled and therefore have unspent personnel funds that can be used for this adjustment. The Executive Department, in agreement with the Police Department, is requesting to have \$69,000 in personnel costs transferred from the Police Department's personnel budget 110-42100 to the City Manager's personnel budget 110-41320. No additional funds will need to be appropriated.

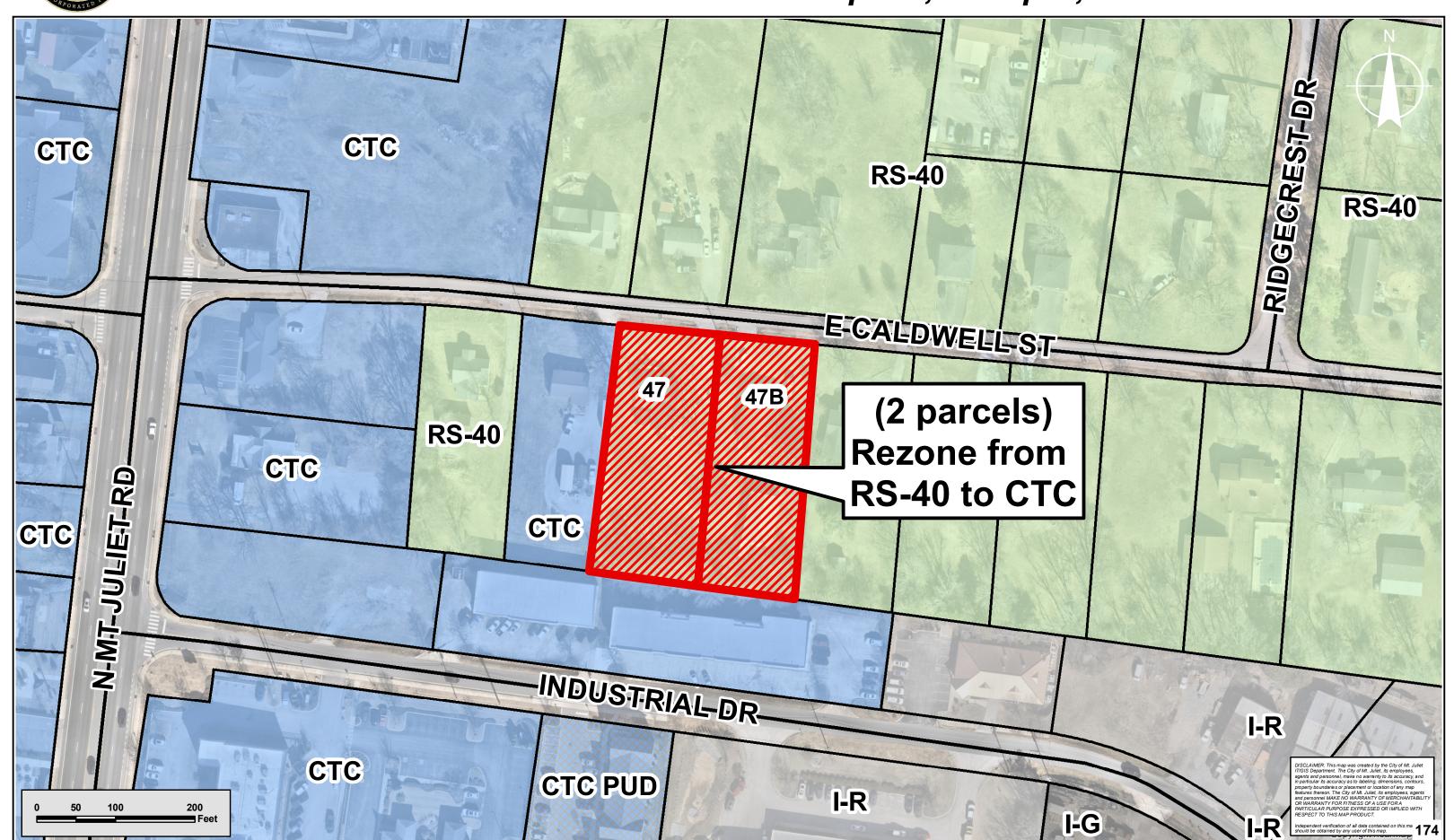

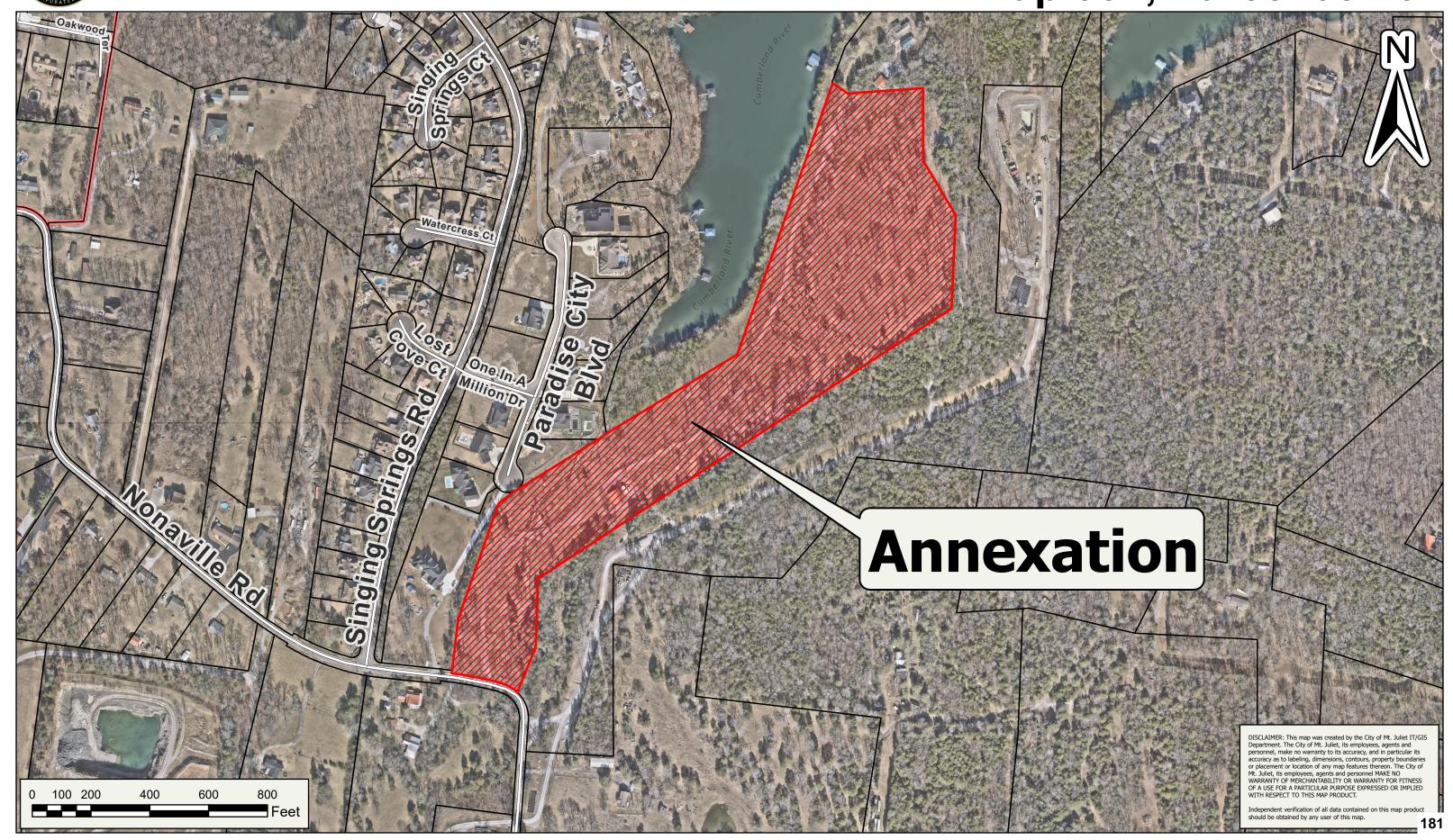

<u>Future Land Use Plan:</u> The City's Future Land Use map identifies the property as medium density residential. Adjacent future land use classifications are also shown as medium density residential. The applicant does not wish to nor need to change the future land use designation.

<u>Zoning</u>: Current zoning is Wilson County R-1. The applicant has not requested a rezone, if annexed it would default to RS-40 zoning.

<u>Annexation</u>: The property is located within the City's urban growth boundary. City limits are across Nonaville Road, approximately 2,700 feet from the subject site at the Royal Oaks subdivision. A plan of services is included.

E. Refuse Collection:

- 5. Traffic signals, traffic signs, street markings, and other traffic control devices will be installed on public streets as the need is established, by appropriate study and traffic standards.

G. Schools:

1. The entire annex area is served by Wilson County Schools. This annexation will have no effect on school districts.

H. Inspection Services:

1. Any inspection service now provided by the City (building, plumbing, electrical, gas, housing and City of Mt. Juliet by Ordinance, etc) will become available in the annexed area on the effective date of annexation.

I. Planning:

1. The Planning Jurisdiction of the City already includes the annexed area. The property herein annexed is recommended to be zoned: RS-40.

J. Street Lighting

1. The City only installs streetlights on main thoroughfares (currently Mt. Juliet Road/SR171 and Lebanon Road/US Highway 70).

Request: Jake Porter with Heritage Civil, on behalf of his client Ripple Creek, LLC., seeks annexation, plan of services, rezone and concept plan approval for a variable lot subdivision on Watermark Way in District 1.

<u>History:</u> The property consists of approximately 10.00 acres (432,752 sf) on Watermark Way, which abuts the Nichols Vale property to the north, just east of Tate Lane. This is currently undeveloped agricultural land. The applicant wishes to develop a 17 lot variable lot subdivision with a base zoning of RS-20. A concept plan has been submitted with this application. A summary of the request is provided below:

<u>Future Land Use Plan:</u> The City's future land use map identifies the area as medium density residential. Adjacent future land use classifications are both medium and low density residential. The applicant does not wish nor need to change the future land use designation.

Zoning: The current zoning is Wilson County R-1. The applicant is seeking RS-20, medium density residential, which is consistent with the surrounding zoning and the City's future land use plan.

Annexation: The property is located within the City's urban growth boundary.

Plan of Service: A plan of services is included.

<u>Findings</u>: In reviewing the requested zoning actions, staff finds that the request agrees with all of the following findings, as contained in the zoning ordinance. The proposed annexation and rezone:

- 1. is in agreement with the general plan for the area, and
- 2. does not contravene the legal purposes for which zoning exists, and
- 3. will have no adverse effect upon joining property owners, unless such effect can be justified by the overwhelming public good or welfare, and
- 4. is not materially beneficial to a property owner or small group of property owners and will not be detrimental to the general public, and
- 5. is possible because conditions affecting the area have changed to a sufficient extent to warrant an amendment to the zoning map, and
- 6. allows uses by right, for which the base infrastructure is in place or will be required, to support their operation.

Concept Plan: The concept plan proposes 17 lots on 10 acres for a density of 1.7 units/acre (2.2 units/acre permitted with RS-20 base zoning). The minimum lot size is 15,000sf and the average lot size is 16,750sf. The bulk regulations for variable lot subdivisions are adhered to, except the waiver request described below. Lot coverage is not to exceed 45% and floor coverage per lot is indicated as at least 3,000sf.

Improved open space totals 1.02 acres (10.24% of the development site) and includes a playground, dog park and walking trails. A mail kiosk is proposed and a detail is provided and acceptable. Streetlights are required per ordinance 25-24. Four parallel on street parking spaces are provided in front of the playground and amenity area. Sidewalk is provided on both sides of all streets.

5-104.4 Residential Design Guidelines: The supplied renderings indicate homes with two car garages and masonry and fiber cement facades. The applicant is seeking a façade material wavier, detailed below. All single-family design guidelines, except any waivers granted, shall be adhered to.

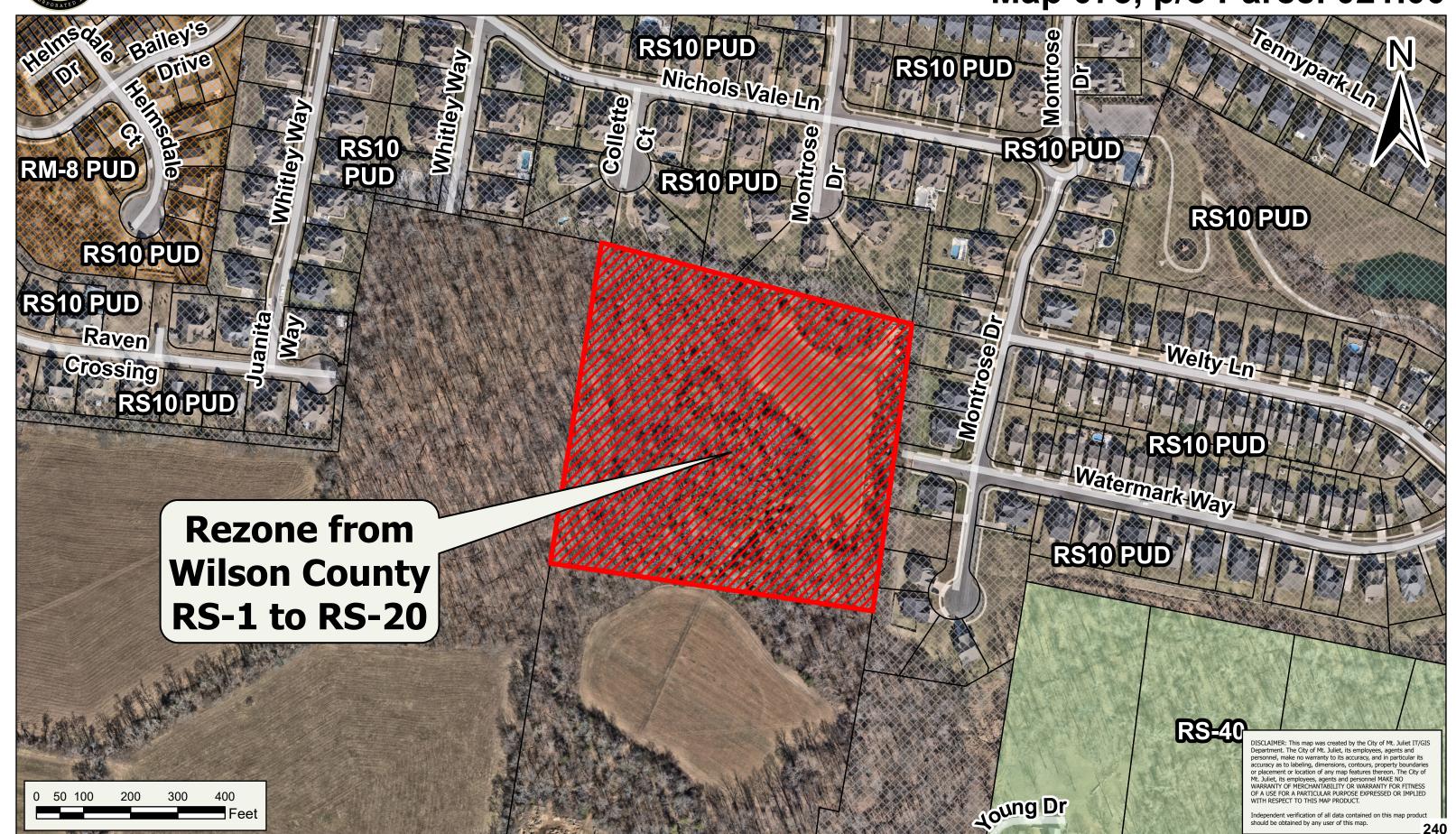

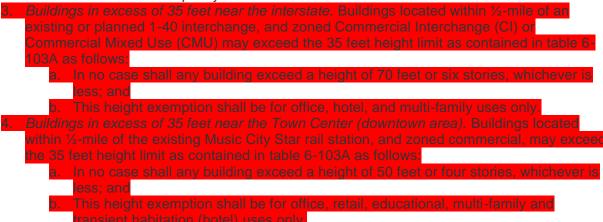

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Mt. Juliet Board of Commissioners, that Part B, Article IX, Section 9-106.4 of the Land Development Code of the City of Mt. Juliet, known as the Zoning Regulations is amended as follows:

Section 1. Zoning Regulation Article IX Section 9-106.4.2, Cross access corridors, is amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Cross-access corridors. The Planning Commission, in conjunction with the City Engineer shall be authorized to designate cross-access corridors on properties adjacent to arterial and major collector streets. All developments within the affected area shall be designed so as to provide for mutually coordinated access easement(s).

Section 2. Zoning Regulation Article IX Section 9-106.4.3, Recording access easements, is amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Recording accessways. Whenever joint access driveways and/or cross access corridors are provided in accordance with the provisions of this section, no development/site plan shall be approved unless such plan grants an easement for cross access for abutting properties. Such designation and/or easement shall be referenced on all plats for any affected property. Easements shall be recorded by the applicant in the Wilson County, Tennessee, Register of Deeds Office, and constitute a covenant running with the land. Cross-access easements shall provide perpetual, non-exclusive access for the purposes of vehicular ingress and egress across the cross-access easement; to include pedestrian if applicable or to match existing connectivity. Whenever joint access driveways and/or cross-access corridors are provided in accordance with the provisions of this section, it is understood that the new development will not be required to get the adjoining property owner to sign any document to provide this access.

Section 3. Zoning Regulation Article IX Section 9-106.4.5, Construction and maintenance, is added to read in its entirety as follows:

Construction and Maintenance. Whenever joint access driveways and/or cross-access corridors are provided in accordance with the provisions of this section, pavement shall be extended to connect to stubs on adjacent properties at the property line(s) or stubbed to the property line(s) where a full connection is not yet possible; when both stubs can be connected it is the financial responsibility of each owner to pay for their property portion of the connection. Property shall not be subdivided to avoid this requirement. Property owner(s) shall maintain and keep the cross access and driveway area within their development in a commercially reasonable condition, state of repair, and free from obstructions or barricades.

Section 4. Zoning Regulation Article IX Section 9-106.4.6, Waiver or modification, is added to read in its entirety as follows:

Waiver or modification. The City may waive or modify joint use driveways or cross access corridors provided in accordance with the provisions of this section on determining that such is impractical or undesirable due to natural features, site design features, or any other features affecting vehicular circulation or safety.

Section 5. Zoning Regulation Article IX Section 9-106.4.7, Responsibility, is added to read in its entirety as follows:

Responsibility. If an adjoining property has already been developed and did not provide stub at property line for future cross access, it is not the responsibility of any new/current property being developed to persuade any adjoining property to connect to them or construct/finance/obtain access agreements for connectivity to the new developing property. It is only the responsibility of new/current property developing to provide access stub to the minimum distance from property line and/or have it noted on recorded plat so

future connectivity could be considered/accomplished. If the adjoining property has already been developed with cross access, the new developing property would match the connection(s) to the new developing property line. If the adjoining property is developed or undeveloped, the developer of the new property will not be required to get a signed easement for cross access from the owner of the adjoining property, but will provide the cross-access easement to property line as described above in this section.

Sec. 9-106. Access management.

9-106.4 Joint and shared accessways.

- Joint use driveways. Wherever feasible, the City may require the establishment of a joint use
 driveway to serve two or more properties. If a proposed development abuts an existing
 development that contains an existing joint access driveway, the vehicular circulation of the
 proposed development shall be designed to connect to the abutting access and circulation
 areas. If a proposed development abuts existing undeveloped property, the vehicular
 circulation of the proposed development shall contain a joint access driveway which is
 designed to connect to the abutting property when such property is developed.
- 2. Cross_access corridors. The Planning Commission, in conjunction with the City Engineer shall be authorized to designate cross_access corridors on properties adjacent to arterial and major collector streets. All developments within the affected area shall be designed so as to provide for mutually coordinated parking, access and circulation systems easement(s).
- 3. Recording accessways easements. Whenever joint access driveways and/or cross access corridors are provided in accordance with the provisions of this section, no development/site plan shall be approved unless such plan grants an easement for cross access for to and from abutting properties. Such designation and/or easement shall be referenced on all plats of subdivision for any affected property. Easements shall be recorded by the applicant in the Wilson County, Tennessee, Register of Deeds Office, and constitute a covenant running with the land. Cross-access easements shall provide perpetual, non-exclusive access for the purposes of vehicular ingress and egress across the cross-access easement; to include pedestrian if applicable or to match existing connectivity. Whenever joint access driveways and/or cross-access corridors are provided in accordance with the provisions of this section, it is understood that the new development will not be required to get the adjoining property owner to sign any document to provide this access.
- 4. Closing of interim driveways. Whenever a permanent joint use driveway and/or a cross_ access corridor is constructed as required by the provisions of this section, all preceding temporary or interim driveways shall be closed and eliminated. The owner(s) of all properties which involve the use of a permanent joint use driveway and/or a cross access corridor shall enter into a written agreement with the City to be recorded in the public records of the County and running with the land, that existing temporary and/or interim driveways shall be closed and eliminated following construction of both sides of a joint access.
- 5. Construction and Maintenance. Whenever joint access driveways and/or cross-access corridors are provided in accordance with the provisions of this section, pavement shall be extended to connect to stubs on adjacent properties at the property line(s) or stubbed to the property line(s) where a full connection is not yet possible; when both stubs can be connected it is the financial responsibility of each owner to pay for their property portion of the connection. Property shall not be subdivided to avoid this requirement. Property owner(s) shall maintain and keep the cross access and driveway area within their development in a commercially reasonable condition, state of repair, and free from obstructions or barricades.
- 6. Waiver or modification. The City may waive or modify joint use driveways or cross access corridors provided in accordance with the provisions of this section on determining that such is impractical or undesirable due to natural features, site design features, or any other features affecting vehicular circulation or safety.
- 7. Responsibility. If an adjoining property has already been developed and did not provide stub at property line for future cross access, it is not the responsibility of any new/current property being developed to persuade any adjoining property to connect to them or construct/finance/obtain access agreements for connectivity to the new developing property. It is only the responsibility of new/current property developing to provide access stub to the minimum distance from

property line and/or have it noted on recorded plat so future connectivity could be considered/accomplished. If the adjoining property has already been developed with cross access, the new developing property would match the connection(s) to the new developing property line. If the adjoining property is developed or undeveloped, the developer of the new property will not be required to get a signed easement for cross access from the owner of the adjoining property, but will provide the cross-access easement to property line as described above in this section.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MT. JULIET, TENNESSEE AND KENNETH D. MARTIN

This Agreement is entered into by and between **THE CITY OF MT. JULIET, TENNESSEE** ('The City"), a municipality organized and existing under the laws and constitution of the State of Tennessee, and **KENNETH D. MARTIN.**

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the City of Mt. Juliet, Tennessee is required, pursuant to Tennessee Code Annotated § 6-21-101, to appoint and fix the salary of the City Manager, who shall serve at the will of the Board of Commissioners, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners has determined that the orderly administration of the business of the City of Mt. Juliet will be served by execution of this Agreement to clearly establish the remuneration and benefits to be afforded the City Manager; and

WHEREAS, the duties and authorities of the City manager are prescribed by Tennessee Code Annotated § 621-101 *et seq.*; and

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the valuable consideration and mutual agreement evidenced by this Agreement, the parties agree as follows:

Section 1. Duties. The City of Mt. Juliet will continue to employ Kenneth D. Martin as City Manager to perform the duties and functions prescribed by Tennessee Code Annotated § 6-21-101 *et seq.*, other state and federal laws applicable to the City, and such duties as may be prescribed by ordinance and resolution of the City of Mt. Juliet. In performance of these duties, Kenneth D. Martin shall act only in the City's interest, shall act in accordance with all state and federal laws and regulations, and all city ordinances. Kenneth D. Martin shall perform all duties in a manner compatible with the trust inherent in public service, shall strive to achieve excellence, efficiency, and economy for the City, shall devote the majority of his time toward managing the City's affairs to the best of his ability, and shall demonstrate at all times fitness for public service and high moral standards of personal conduct.

Section 2. Terms of Employment. Except as otherwise modified by this Agreement, Kenneth D. Martin shall be subject to the same terms and conditions of employment as other City employees, as established in the City's personnel ordinances and resolutions.

Section 3. Termination of Employment and Appointment. The parties agree to enter into this agreement regarding Kenneth D. Martin's employment beginning July 19, 2023. The employment of Kenneth D. Martin as City Manager is strictly "at-will". Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent, limit, or otherwise interfere with the right of the City of Mt. Juliet to terminate the employment and appointment of Kenneth D. Martin as City Manager at any time, subject

to the limitations of Tennessee Code Annotated 6-21-101 and the provisions set forth in this Agreement.

The City of Mt. Juliet may terminate this Agreement and the employment and appointment of Kenneth D. Martin as City Manager at any time upon a four-fifths (4/5) vote of the Board of Commissioners.

With good cause shown for termination, Kenneth D. Martin shall not be entitled to receive any remuneration for severance but shall receive payment for accrued vacation leave to the extent that such payment for vacation leave does not exceed one (1) month's salary.

Without good cause shown for termination, Kenneth D. Martin shall be entitled to severance equal to six (6) months' salary and shall receive payment for accrued vacation leave, but in no event shall payment for vacation leave exceed 2 months' salary.

In the event that Kenneth D. Martin resigns from employment as City Manager, the Board of Commissioners shall be provided at least sixty (60) days written notice in advance of the effective date of such resignation. If this notice is not provided, Kenneth D. Martin shall forfeit payment for all accrued vacation leave. Should the Board of Commissioners decline to continue Kenneth D. Martin's employment and appointment during this sixty (60) day period, Kenneth D. Martin shall be paid his regular rate of pay for the balance of the sixty (60) day period remaining after the Board of Commissioners declines to continue his appointment and employment. Additionally, should the Board of Commissioners decline to continue Kenneth D. Martin's employment and appointment during the sixty (60) day period, he shall receive payment for accrued vacation leave, but in no event shall payment for vacation leave exceed one (1) month's salary.

Section 4. Salary. As consideration for his performance of duties as City Manager, Kenneth D. Martin shall be paid a salary of \$175,760.00 for Fiscal Year 2023/2024, thereafter, Kenneth D. Martin would receive the same increases in pay as all City employees.

Section 5. Leave and Attendance. Kenneth D. Martin shall accrue sick leave at the same rate as other City employees, in accordance with the City's personnel ordinances and resolutions. Kenneth D. Martin serves as an executive, salaried employee of the City and, accordingly, shall not be entitled to receive overtime compensation. Kenneth D. Martin shall be entitled to compensatory leave, which must be used during the same two-week pay period in which the compensatory leave was earned. Any compensatory time not utilized in the same pay period in which it was earned shall not carry forward

into future pay periods, and Kenneth D. Martin shall not otherwise be entitled to compensatory leave. Kenneth D. Martin shall be entitled to four (4) weeks of vacation leave each year.

Section 6. Outside Employment. Kenneth D. Martin may engage in employment outside of his employment with the City of Mt. Juliet as a teacher or educational instructor if such employment does not interfere with his job duties to the City, allows him to remain available for emergency response situations, and takes place outside of regular city business hours.

Section 7. Conflicts of Interest. Kenneth D. Martin shall avoid any interest which will conflict with those interests of the City of Mt. Juliet, subject to the laws of Tennessee and the City's ordinances and resolutions, including but not limited to, the City's Code of Ethics.

Section 8. City Vehicle and Travel Expenses. Kenneth **D.** Martin shall be provided with a gasoline credit card similar to cards used by other City employees for City vehicles. At his election, Kenneth **D.** Martin shall be entitled to drive a city vehicle in the ordinary course of City business.

Section 9. Insurance. Kenneth D. Martin shall be eligible for health, dental, and vision insurance, as well as other insurance benefits as are afforded to all full-time City employees.

Section 10. Membership Dues of Professional City Manager Associations. The City agrees to pay any membership dues necessary to maintain Kenneth D. Martin's membership in professional associations or organizations, whose primary goal is to promote professionalism among City or municipal managers. Annual payment of these membership dues shall be limited to the amount of funding appropriated by the **Board** of Commissioners in the City's annual budget.

Section 12. Retirement Kenneth D. Martin shall be eligible to participate in the Tennessee Consolidated Retirement System ("TCRS") or any other retirement benefit arrangement established by the City of Mt. Juliet for the benefit of its employees, subject to the limitations of TCRS or such retirement arrangement.

Section 12. Legality. Kenneth D. Martin acknowledges that he has been advised to consult with, and afforded an opportunity to seek the advice of, independent legal counsel regarding this Agreement.

Section 13, Governing Law and Documents. The validity, construction, and effect of this Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Tennessee.

Section 14. Residency Requirement. As stated in Ordinance 2012-52 Kenneth D. Martin would not be required to move or live inside the City limits since he is a current employee of the City of Mt. Juliet.

Section 15. Conflicting or Ambiguous Provisions; Priority. In the event of conflicting or ambiguous provisions of this Agreement, the terms of this Agreement shall be construed according to the following priorities:

- a) Any **properly** executed amendment or change to the Agreement (most recent with first priority);and
- b) This Agreement
- c) Tennessee Code Annotated § 6-18-1010 et seq.; and
- d) Ordinance and Resolutions of the City of Mt. Juliet, Tennessee

Section 16. Severability. Should any provision of this Agreement be declared to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall be severed and shall not affect the validity and enforceability of the remaining provisions of this Agreement.

In witness of all of the foregoing consideration, terms, and conditions as evidenced by their signature below, the City of Mt. Juliet, Tennessee and Kenneth D. Martin hereby and be bound by all of the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

PART II - CODE OF ORDINANCES Chapter 2 - ADMINISTRATION ARTICLE XII. CODE OF ETHICS

ARTICLE XII. CODE OF ETHICS

Sec. 2-355. Ethics commission.

- (a) There is hereby created a five-member ethics commission to be approved by the board of commissioners. Each commissioner shall nominate a member for appointment to the ethics commission who is a resident of his district, and the mayor shall nominate a member for appointment to the ethics commission who is a resident of the city. Such appointments shall be confirmed by a majority vote of the board of commissioners.
- (b) Members of the ethics commission shall each serve a term of three years or until their successors are appointed, whichever is later. Members of the ethics commission shall serve without compensation. Should any vacancies occur, the nominating member of the board of commissioners shall nominate a replacement, and the board of commissioners shall appoint a replacement member.
- (c) A person is eligible to serve as a member of the ethics commission if the person has never been convicted of a felony, resides in the city while serving as specified in subsection (a) of this section and is a registered voter in the county, is not an employee of city government, does not hold any elected or appointed office in county government or in city government, does not hold any elected office in state government or the government of the United States, and is not a candidate for any elected office in county government, city government, state government, or the government of the United States. A person is not eligible to serve as a member of the ethics commission if that person has a personal interest as defined in this article.
