

## **RESOLUTION 12-2025**

### **RESOLUTION APPROVING THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MT. JULIET, TENNESSEE, AND MIDDLE TENNESSEE ELECTRIC MEMBERSHIP CORPORATION (MTE) FOR THE BECKWITH ROAD UTILITY RELOCATION AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SIGN THE AGREEMENT**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Mt. Juliet seeks to improve roadway safety and capacity within the City; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of Mt. Juliet plans to construct an intersection improvement project at the intersection of Beckwith Road and S.Rultand/Posey Hill Road (“Project”) and for said Project to be constructed it will be necessary for MTE to relocate its facilities, 60% of which are located in public right-of-way and 40% of which are located on private utility easement; and

**WHEREAS**, MTE has furnished the City with an estimate and relocation plans showing the cost and manner of relocating these facilities, including engineering, which estimate is in the amount of \$403,126.70, and of which 40% represents the pro-rata share to which MTE is entitled to reimbursement for relocation of utility facilities located on private utility easement, and 60% represents the pro-rata share for relocation of utility facilities located on public highway right-of-way; and

**WHEREAS**, the City is liable for the relocation of utility facilities located on private utility easement, but is not liable for adjustment of facilities located in publicly owned right-of-way, and

**WHEREAS**, the parties wish to enter into an agreement to provide for the relocation of said facilities.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Mt. Juliet, Wilson County, Tennessee as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners approves the Agreement with MTE.

Section 2. Mayor James Maness is hereby authorized to execute the said Agreement with MTE.

Section 3. In the event of conflict between this resolution or any part hereof, and the whole or part of any existing resolution of the City, the conflicting resolution is repealed to the extent of the conflict but no further.

Section 4. If any section, clause, provision or portion of the resolution is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, provision or portion of the resolution.

## **RESOLUTION 12-2025**

This Resolution shall take effect at the earliest date allowed by law, the public welfare requiring it.
