## **RESOLUTION -2024**

## A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTION OF A CONTRACT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MT. JULIET AND COLLINS CONSTRUCTION FOR RENOVATION OF THE NEW PARKS ANNEX BUILDING

**WHEREAS,** the City of Mt. Juliet Parks Department desires to provide safe and adequate facilities for the citizens, and;

**WHEREAS,** the City desires to remodel the new Charlie Daniels Park Annex Building for a facility adequate to provide community space and a safer, more secure environment to accommodate for the growth of the city, and;

**WHEREAS,** upon proper execution of an RFP for construction services, review, and evaluation of the submitted proposals, Collins Construction was selected to complete the project, and;

**WHEREAS,** Collins Construction has provided the City with a contract for the construction services at a cost of \$156,725.00 for this project; and

**WHEREAS,** the City of Mt. Juliet Board of Commissioners desires to approve the contract with Collins Construction.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Mt. Juliet, Wilson County, Tennessee as follows:

**Section 1.** The Board of Commissioners approves the contract with Collins Construction pending approval of the City Attorney.

**Section 2.** The Board authorizes the Mayor to execute the contract with Collins Construction.

**Section 3.** In the event of conflict between this resolution or any part hereof, and the whole or part of any existing resolution of the City, the conflicting resolution is repealed to the extent of the conflict but no further.

**Section 4.** If any section, clause, provision, or portion of the resolution is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, provision, or portion of the resolution.

This Resolution shall take effect at the earliest date allowed by law, the public welfare requiring it.
