

RESOLUTION -2026

A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF MT. JULIET, TENNESSEE AND THE TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION (TDOT) FOR THE MT. JULIET ROAD ADA UPGRADES, PHASE II PROJECT AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO SIGN THE AMENDMENT

WHEREAS, the City of Mt. Juliet seeks to improve multimodal connectivity and transportation options for all users, including those with disabilities within the City; and

WHEREAS, this project will replace existing sidewalks along both sides of Mt. Juliet Road from Old Lebanon Dirt Road to Weston Drive with six-foot-wide sidewalks that meet ADA regulations; and

WHEREAS, the City's ADA Transition Plan identified this section of Mt. Juliet Road as the most non-compliant and highest priority; and

WHEREAS, the City of Mt. Juliet desires to coordinate with the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT) for the construction of this project; and

WHEREAS, TDOT has provided the City of Mt. Juliet with an amendment to the agreement for the purpose of providing an understanding between the parties of their respective obligations related to the management of the project, and

WHEREAS, the City of Mt. Juliet desires to approve the amendment with TDOT for the project.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Mt. Juliet, Wilson County, Tennessee as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners approves the Amendment with TDOT.

Section 2. Mayor James Maness is hereby authorized to execute the said Amendment with TDOT.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED

In case of conflict between this resolution or any part hereof, and the whole part of any existing resolution of the City, the conflicting resolution is repealed to the extent of the conflict but no further.

If any section, clause, or provision or portion of this resolution is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, or provision or portion of this resolution.

This resolution shall take effect on the earliest date allowed by law.
