

**RESOLUTION 56-2024**

**RESOLUTION SUPPORTING A GRANT APPLICATION FOR THE BELINDA PARKWAY SIDEWALK, PHASE II PROJECT BY THE CITY OF MT. JULIET FOR THE TENNESSEE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION'S (TDOT) UPCOMING TAP GRANT CYCLE**

**WHEREAS**, the City of Mt. Juliet seeks to improve multimodal connectivity to provide alternative transportation options for all users; and

**WHEREAS**, the Mt. Juliet BPAC supports and recommends the grant application for TDOT's upcoming TAP grant cycle for the Belinda Parkway Sidewalk, Phase II project; and

**WHEREAS**, this project will construct a 6-foot-wide sidewalk along the north/east side of Belinda Parkway from the Mundy Memorial Park trail entrance to S. Rutland Road and will include a connection to the existing Providence Greenway Trail along S. Rutland; and

**WHEREAS**, this project is being submitted for TDOT's Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant) cycle, which covers 80% of the construction costs for the project, if awarded.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Commissioners of the City of Mt. Juliet, Wilson County, Tennessee as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners support the grant application for the Belinda Parkway Sidewalk, Phase II project and the matching fund requirements, as illustrated in the executive summary, for TDOT's upcoming grant cycle.

Section 2. In the event of conflict between this resolution or any part hereof, and the whole or part of any existing resolution of the City, the conflicting resolution is repealed to the extent of the conflict but no further.

Section 3. If any section, clause, provision or portion of the resolution is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect any other section, clause, provision or portion of the resolution.

This Resolution shall take effect at the earliest date allowed by law, the public welfare requiring it.
